



# Enforcenomics: Why Water is Important for California's Economy

**Course Description:**

This course will cover some basic principles of economics as they relate to regulatory enforcement; specifically, how to use economic principles to craft and impose effective enforcement orders. Topics to be discussed include the four basic elements that a penalty must address: economic benefit, bringing facilities into compliance, deterring future violations, and compensating society for the damage done.
