STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 71-35

AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF OF THE
DIVISION OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES
TO EXECUTE AGREEMENT BETWEEN
THE STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD AND
THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION FOR
ASSISTANCE IN DETERMINING MEASURES
TO ABATE POLLUTION FROM THE WALKER MINE, PLUMAS COUNTY

WHEREAS, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region has initiated an abatement action against the owners of the Walker Mine in Plumas County, and

WHEREAS, the abatement of pollution caused by the mine will be a complex problem which must be studied at length to determine the best method of control, and

WHEREAS, the Division of Mines and Geology of the Department of Conservation is qualified and equipped to conduct a reconnaissance study of the problem; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Board authorize the Chief of the Division of Administrative Services to execute an agreement with the Department of Conservation to enable them to conduct a reconnaissance study and prepare a report for the Regional Board describing additional steps necessary to abate pollution caused by the mine, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the agreement shall be limited to the 1971-72 fiscal year and for an amount not to exceed \$5,000.
