
RESOLUTION NO. 75-13

GUIDELINES FOR DISBURSEMENT OF MONEY
FROM THE STATE WATER POLLUTION
CLEANUP AND ABATEMENT ACCOUNT
FEBRUARY 20, 1975

Funds from the State Water Pollution Cleanup and Abatement Account are available (1) to support cleanup, abatement, and other remedial work when prompt action is needed to prevent substantial pollution, nuisance, or injury to waters of the State; and (2) to abate a condition of pollution or nuisance from a nonoperating industrial or business location.

Requests for cleanup and abatement funds often arise in emergency situations making it imperative to eliminate formality and bureaucratic delay. If an Executive Officer of a Regional Board considers the use of cleanup and abatement money appropriate, he should make a request for commitment of funds from the Cleanup and Abatement Account to the Chief Counsel, or in his absence, the Deputy Executive Officer, or in his absence, the Executive Officer of the State Board. It is expected that the request will be in the form of a phone call in which the circumstances giving rise to the request and the sum of money needed will be related. Sources of payment other than from the Cleanup and Abatement Account should be explored where time permits.

In cases where a request for cleanup and abatement funds comes from a public agency other than a Regional Board, the agency making the request should ordinarily be directed to the Executive Officer of the appropriate Regional Board for review and recommendation by that Executive Officer to the Chief Counsel, Deputy Executive Officer or Executive Officer.

Upon receipt of an appropriate request for cleanup and abatement funds, the Chief Counsel, Deputy Executive Officer or Executive Officer shall determine whether cleanup and abatement funds should be committed, and, if so, the extent to which such funds should be committed.

Prior to any commitment of funds, the Chief Counsel, Deputy Executive Officer or Executive Officer will determine the amount of funds available in the Cleanup and Abatement Account. The Division of Administrative Services will be notified of any amount committed.
