

STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD
RESOLUTION NO. 75-42

AUTHORIZING A REDUCTION IN THE REQUIRED
WASTEWATER CAPITAL RESERVE FUND (WRCF)
FOR HAPPY CAMP SANITARY DISTRICT TO
1 PERCENT OF THE CONSTRUCTION COSTS OF THE
TREATMENT PLANT AND PUMP STATIONS PLUS THE
PRINCIPAL PAYMENTS ON BOND DEBT.

WHEREAS:

1. The Happy Camp Sanitary District has submitted a facilities planning report to construct sewage facilities to correct a serious community health hazard.
2. The Happy Camp Sanitary District, pursuant to Article 1, Section 3, of the Revenue Program Guidelines (September 1974) has asked the State Board to reduce the contribution to the WRCF to 1 percent of the construction costs of the treatment plant and pump station plus principal payments on bond debt.
3. Happy Camp Sanitary District's proposal will reduce the impact on the community of the local share of the sewerage system construction costs.
4. The proposed lower contribution will still have a significant financial impact on the residents of Happy Camp where the median annual family income was estimated to be \$10,000 in 1969 and unemployment is currently 28 percent.
5. The Board will be asked to reinstate the rate of accrual set forth in Article 4, Section 3(a) and (b) of the Revenue Program Guidelines, if annual operation and maintenance inspections by the State Board's staff reveal that adequate equipment replacements are not being made as a result of lack of available funds.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Board grants a reduction in the annual WRCF contribution for the Happy Camp Sanitary District to 1 percent of the construction costs of the treatment plant and pump station plus the principal payments on bond debt. Total annual revenue collected by the

Happy Camp Sanitary District through a combination of user charges and special assessments for bond service (principal and interest) must be sufficient to pay operation and maintenance costs, bond service, and 1 percent of the construction costs.
