

STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD
RESOLUTION NO. 83-4
CERTIFYING IN PART AMENDMENTS TO THE AREA-
WIDE WASTE TREATMENT MANAGEMENT (208) PLAN
FOR THE SOUTH COAST PLANNING AREA

WHEREAS:

1. The Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), as the designated 208 planning agency for the South Coast Area, prepared the 1979 Areawide Waste Treatment (208) Plan; which Plan was certified by the State Water Resources Control Board and approved by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency in 1980.
2. SCAG has amended its 208 Plan, and has submitted the amendments to the State Water Resources Control Board in accordance with the provisions of 40 CFR 35.1523-2.
3. The State Water Resources Control Board is required by the provisions of 40 CFR 35.1523-3 to evaluate the SCAG amendments and to certify, or not to certify, them as being in conformance with the evaluation criteria specified in 40 CFR 35.1523-2 and 35.1533-1; and to inform the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency as to its findings.
4. The State Water Resources Control Board has found the following SCAG 208 Plan amendments to be in conformance with the criteria for certification:
 - o Hazardous Material Response Plan
 - o Coastal Malibu Wastewater Plan
 - o Newport Bay Watershed - Construction Activities
 - o Newport Bay-Agricultural Activities
 - o Agricultural and Related Nonpoint Sources of Pollution
 - o Streamzone Protection Plan
 - o Publicly Owned Systems - Facilities Planning and Growth Management Coordination
 - o Los Angeles/Orange County Metropolitan Area Sludge Management Program
5. The Cities of Irvine and Newport Beach meet the requirements for management agencies as specified in 40 CFR 35.1521-3(c).
6. The two Newport Bay-related amendments will not ensure the long-term protection of Newport Bay from the effects of erosion caused by construction and agricultural activities.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:


That the State Board hereby:

1. Unconditionally certifies the following SCAG 208 Plan Amendments:

- o Hazardous Material Response Plan
 - o Coastal Malibu Wastewater Plan
 - o Newport Bay - Construction Activities
 - o Newport Bay - Agricultural Activities
 - o Agricultural and Related Nonpoint Sources of Pollution
 - o Streamzone Protection Plan
 - o Publicly Owned Systems - Facilities Planning and Growth Management Coordination
 - o Los Angeles/Orange County Metropolitan Area Sludge Management Program.
2. Designates the Cities of Newport Beach and Irvine as management agencies for agricultural erosion in the Newport Bay watershed. Designation will be for the implementation period specified in the amendment, and is scheduled to elapse November 30, 1987. Should an alternative schedule be approved by the State Board, the designation period will change accordingly.
3. Accepts the two Newport Bay-related amendments as interim plans. The State Board expects that the SCAG Comprehensive Sediment Control Plan for the Newport Bay watershed, currently being developed, will provide for more effective land-use controls of construction and agricultural-related erosion.
