Subject: 2/2/16 BOARD MEETING (Conservation Extended Emergency Regulation).

I believe that most of California and, in particular, Northern California, the residents have done a remarkable job of not just responding to the drought, but have gone the extra mile in making strong efforts to conserve water. The dip in December from a requested 33 % to a usage of 26.4 % reduction compared to use in 2013 is still tremendous. Now that we are finally experiencing not only good, consistent rainfall here in Northern California, but adding an extensive snow pack, I think it is only fair to wait on the snow pack evaluation and water supply conditions in April instead of forcing the 33 % conservation requirement in early February. I'm not saying we need to stop conserving, because that is definitely and clearly not the case, but I I don't think we have to continue to be held the 33 % reduction requirement at the present time. The weather storms continue to line up and it is very, very promising.
