**REVISED NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY
WATER QUALITY ORDER 2003-0003-DWQ
STATEWIDE WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR DISCHARGES TO LAND
WITH A LOW THREAT TO WATER QUALITY
PILLSBURY ROAD PARTNERS, LLC
GRIFFIN PARK SUBDIVISION DEWATERING PROJECT,
SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY**

This Notice of Applicability (NOA) has been edited since it was originally issued on 9 February 2021 because the CIWQS Place Identification number was incorrect. The CIWQS Place ID presented in this Revised NOA is correct.

On 15 January 2021, Pillsbury Road Partners, LLC (Discharger) submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) to obtain coverage under Water Quality Order 2003-0003-DWQ, *Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges to Land with a Low Threat to Water Quality* (hereafter General Order) for construction dewatering during the installation of underground utilities for a private subdivision. The submittal contains all the information required to evaluate applicability of the General Order; therefore, the NOI is considered complete. Based on the information provided in the NOI, the discharge meets the conditions of the General Order. The discharge is hereby covered under State Water Resources Control Board General Order 2003-0003-DWQ-0219. Please include this number on all correspondence related to this discharge.

PROJECT LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION

The project is located near the intersection of Main Street and Tannehill Drive in Manteca, as shown on Attachment A. The project consists of installing dewatering wells to facilitate the installation of underground utilities. Approximately 1 million gallons per day are expected to be discharged to the bermed area shown on Attachment A for percolation and evaporation. The dewatering activities are expected to start mid-February 2021 and continue through Spring 2021.

There are no known contaminated groundwater sites within a mile of the project.

The Water Quality Control Plan for the Sacramento River and San Joaquin River Basins, Fifth Edition, revised May 2018 (hereafter Basin Plan), designates beneficial

uses, establishes water quality objectives, contains implementation plans and policies for protecting waters of the basin, and incorporates by reference plans and policies adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board. Pursuant to §13263(a) of the California Water Code (CWC), waste discharge requirements must implement the Basin Plan.

FACILITY-SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

The General Order and this Notice of Applicability regulates construction dewatering for the Griffin Park Subdivision Dewatering Project.

1. Wastewater generated during construction dewatering shall be disposed of as described in the Notice of Intent, and in accordance with the requirements contained in the General Order.
2. Construction dewatering discharge at a location or in a manner different from that described in the Notice of Intent or this Notice of Applicability is prohibited.
3. All technical reports required herein that involve evaluation, or other work requiring interpretation and proper application of engineering or geologic sciences, shall be prepared by or under the direction of persons registered to practice in California pursuant to California Business and Professions Code, section 6735, 7835, and 7835.1. As required by these laws, completed technical reports must bear the signature(s) and seal(s) of the registered professional(s) in a manner such that all work can be clearly attributed to the professional responsible for the work.
4. Monitoring results shall be submitted on a semi-annual basis in accordance the General Order's Monitoring and Reporting Program. For the January through June reporting period, the monitoring report is **due August 15**. For the July through December reporting period, the monitoring report is **due February 15**.
5. The Discharger shall submit the required annual fee (as specified in the annual billing issued by the State Water Resources Control Board) until the Notice of Applicability is officially terminated.
6. Failure to abide by the conditions of the General Order, including its monitoring and reporting requirements, and this letter authorizing applicability could result in enforcement actions, as authorized by provisions of the California Water Code.
