ORDER NO- R5-2007-0159

RESCINDING VARIOUS WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

Resolution No. 60-212, adopted 23 June 1960, prescribes requirements for the discharge of crude oil production wastewater to sumps for Getty Oil Company at various leases in the E ¹/₂ of T31S, R29E, MDB&M, Mountain View Oil Field, Kern County. Inspections have confirmed that discharge to the Mountain View Oil Field sumps has been discontinued, the sumps permanently removed from service, and are considered closed. Production wastewater is directed to Class II lease injection wells for disposal under permit by the California Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources. (CDH)

WDRs Resolution No. 70-205, adopted 26 June 1970 prescribes requirements for the New Idria Mine for the discharge of mill waste, mine water, and sewage effluent to San Carlos Creek in San Benito County. Resolution 70-205 does not reflect the current status or ownership of the mine and does not reflect current regulations and policies of the Central Valley Water Board. The New Idria Mine is abandoned and the Discharger named in the Resolution no longer exists. Recission of the Resolution is appropriate. (REH)

WDRs Order No. R5-2007-0067 (NPDES No. CA0082082), adopted 22 June 2007, prescribes requirements for the California Dairies, Inc., Los Banos Foods, Inc., discharge of single pass non-contact cooling water via a City of Los Banos storm water pipe to the San Luis Canal. California Dairies, Inc., has permanently disconnected its discharge from the storm water pipe and ceased discharge to the San Luis Canal. By letter dated 22 August 2007, California Dairies, Inc., requested termination of Order No. 2007-0067. The Order is no longer needed and should be rescinded. (WDH)

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above waste discharge requirements Orders and Resolutions are rescinded.
