CITY OF WOODLAND
WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT
YOLO COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region, (hereafter referred to as Central Valley Water Board) finds that:

1. The City of Woodland (Discharger) owns and operates a wastewater treatment plant. The Discharger was previously regulated under Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Orders 98-021, R5-2003-0031, R5-2003-0031-R01, and, as of 5 February 2009, is regulated under WDRs Order R5-2009-0010 (NPDES No. CA0077950).
2. On 23 January 1998, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Cease and Desist Order (CDO) 98-022 for the City of Woodland's wastewater treatment plant. The CDO provided a timeline and required full compliance with beryllium, bis(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate, BOD, chlorine residual, mercury, oil and grease, organochlorine pesticides, total coliform organisms, total suspended solids, and settleable solids effluent limitations by 30 December 2002. The Discharger improved its operations and demonstrated full compliance with the effluent limitations for the above constituents by 30 December 2002.
3. On 13 March 2003, the Central Valley Water Board issued CDO R5-2003-0032. On 16 September 2005, the Central Valley Water Board issued CDO R5-2003-0032-R01. The CDOs provided a timeline and required full compliance with the effluent limitations for aluminum and mercury by 30 March 2008.
4. In 2006 and 2007, the Discharger constructed tertiary filtration and ultraviolet disinfection. As of December 2007, the Discharger has achieved compliance with the limitations in Orders 98-021, R5-2003-0031, and R5-2003-0031-R01.
5. The Central Valley Water Board has notified the Discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to rescind Orders 98-022, R5-2003-0032, and R5-2003-0032-R01, and has provided them with an opportunity for a public hearing and an opportunity for them to submit their written views and recommendations.

6. Issuance of this Order is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.), in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15321(a) (2).
7. The Central Valley Water Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments and evidence pertaining to this matter.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Cease and Desist Orders 98-022, R5-2003-0032, and R5-2003-0032-R01 are rescinded.
