SUBJECT: Consideration of Adoption of the Central Valley Region  
Emergency, Abandoned and Recalcitrant 2009/2010 Annual Site  
Priority List

DISCUSSION: Chapter 6.75 of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes the State Water Resources Control Board to provide underground storage tank (UST) Cleanup Funds to Regional Water Boards and local UST agencies for emergency, abandoned or recalcitrant owner situations. The funds may be used for direct cleanup of petroleum contaminated UST sites requiring emergency or prompt corrective action to protect human health or the environment. For abandoned sites and sites with a recalcitrant owner the sites must be placed on a statewide list to be considered for cleanup funding. These funds allow the Regional Board or a local agency to hire a contractor to do investigations and remedial work at the site.

The FY 2008/2009 Central Valley Regional Board list, coordinated with local UST agencies to protect water quality and public health, contains a total of twenty five (25) sites located in Butte, Calaveras, Kern, Lake, Merced, Sacramento, San Joaquin, Shasta, Stanislaus, Solano, and Yuba Counties.

The proposed Resolution forwards the funding request for the nominated sites to the State Board to place the sites on the State Priority List. The State Board amends the State Priority List annually in July.

Expended funds are subject to a cost recovery program administered by the State Board.
