NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

**RENEWAL OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS (WDR)
NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES)

The River Highlands Community Services District and the County of Yuba (Discharger) own the Hammonton Gold Village Wastewater Treatment Plant. The package treatment system is a membrane biological reactor system with a design flow of 50,000 gallons per day (gpd). The system provides primary screening, nitrification, de-nitrification, microfiltration, and ultraviolet light disinfection prior to land disposal. The existing NPDES Permit (R5-2002-0101) currently allows a year round surface water discharge of up to 260,000 gallons per day. Treated disinfected wastewater is discharged to the unnamed tributary of Sanford Creek, which flows to Sanford Creek, to Big Ravine, and then to the Yuba River below Englebright Dam. The proposed Order allows for the discharge during wet weather periods only. The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) will consider renewal of the Discharger's existing NPDES Permit.

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

- County Of Yuba

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **14 July 2011**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and, in particular, how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

The tentative NPDES Permit was issued on 14 June 2011. Persons wishing to comment on the noticed hearing item must submit testimony, evidence, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than 5:00 p.m. on **14 July 2011**. Written evidence or comments submitted after 5:00 p.m. on **14 July 2011** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
