ORDER R5-2011-XXXX

RESCISSION OF CEASE AND DESIST ORDER R5-2006-0001
FOR RANCHO MURIETA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT AND
RANCHO MURIETA COUNTRY CLUB

SACRAMENTO COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region, (hereafter referred to as "Central Valley Water Board") finds that:

1. On 26 January 2006, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Cease and Desist Order ("CDO") R5-2006-0001 for the Rancho Murieta Wastewater Treatment Facility ("WWTF"). The WWTF is owned and operated by Rancho Murieta Community Services District ("RMCS D"), and the golf course disposal area is owned and operated by Rancho Murieta Country Club ("RMCC"). RMCS D and RMCC are hereafter referred to individually by their respective acronyms and are jointly referred to as "Discharger".
2. The Dischargers are regulated under Waste Discharge Requirements ("WDRs") Order R5-01-124.
3. The Central Valley Water Board adopted CDO R5-2006-0001 to address the following compliance issues:
 - a. Overflows of reclaimed water from the golf course storage lakes to surface water.
 - b. Inadequate wastewater storage and disposal capacity at the WWTF.
 - c. Odors associated with storage and use of reclaimed water at the country club golf courses.
 - d. Potential groundwater degradation at the WWTF.
4. CDO R5-2006-0001 required the Discharger to complete the following tasks:
 - a. Cease all discharges to surface water from Bass Lake, Lake 10, Lake 11, Lake 16, and Lake 17, and any golf course lake, pond, or other water feature that receives reclaimed water for either storage or aesthetic purposes, or obtain an NPDES Permit that regulates overflow discharges from any golf course lake that receives reclaimed water.
 - b. Submit a report specifying the selected compliance option and detailing a proposed scope and schedule of work for complete implementation of the selected option.

- c. Submit a technical report certifying full compliance with Discharge Prohibition I.1 and Discharge Specifications J.7, J.8, and J.9 of the WDRs.
 - d. Ensure continuous compliance with Discharge Prohibition A.1 and Discharge Specification B.11 of the WDRs.
 - e. Submit an *Interim Wastewater Containment Compliance Plan* detailing specific actions that will be taken to ensure continuous compliance with Discharge Prohibition A.1 and Discharge Specification B.11 of the WDRs.
 - f. Submit a *Wastewater Facilities and Financing Plan* for all work and improvements needed to provide adequate treatment, storage, and disposal capacity to accommodate all planned growth through final build out or at least 2019.
 - g. Submit a copy of the notice provided to customers regarding reporting and resolution of odor complaints.
 - h. Certify completion of the Bass Lake improvements to improve circulation and dissolved oxygen.
 - i. Submit an *Irrigation System Odor Management Plan* that describes in detail the operational procedures to be employed to minimize odors associated with stagnant water within the golf course sprinkler systems and all golf course ponds and lakes.
 - j. Submit a *Groundwater Monitoring Well Installation Workplan and Monitoring Well Installation Report*.
 - k. *Submit a Background Groundwater Quality Study and Degradation Assessment Report*.
 - l. Submit quarterly progress reports describing the work completed.
5. The Discharger has achieved compliance by completing all of the tasks in CDO R5-2006-0001.
 6. The Central Valley Water Board has notified the Discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to rescind CDO R5-2006-0001 and has provided them with an opportunity for a public hearing and an opportunity to submit written comments and additional evidence.
 7. CDO R5-2006-0001 is being rescinded because all of the requirements contained in that Order have been met. Therefore, there are no environmental consequences that will result from the rescission of CDO R5-2006-0001. This Order is not subject to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Pub. Resources Code, § 21000 et seq.) in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15061(b)(3).
 8. The Central Valley Water Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments and evidence pertaining to this matter.
