SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY**

The Stockton Port District (Permittee) owns and operates the Port of Stockton (Port) and its storm sewer system. Storm water and non-storm water discharges from the Port are currently regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements Order R5-2011-0005, issued by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) on 3 February 2011. The Permittee developed a Storm Water Management Plan (SWMP) to comply with the Order. The tentative SWMP describes how the Permittee will implement best management practices to control the discharge of pollutants from its MS4. The SWMP provides an overview of the Port facility and program objectives, identification of best management practices, and information on the monitoring and reporting program. Order R5-2011-0005 requires that the SWMP be approved by the Central Valley Water Board.

Only designated parties will have the following rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m.** on **28 August 2014**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

Persons wishing to comment on this noticed hearing item must submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m.** on **28 August 2014**. Written evidence or comments submitted after **5:00 p.m.** on **28 August 2014** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Chair. Any party requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Board Chair must find that accepting the late submission will not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any Designated Party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
