Colorado River Salinity Control Forum Work Group Meeting: The Colorado River Salinity Work Group met June 4 and 7 to discuss and run through presentations for the June 9, 2021 meeting of the Colorado River Salinity Forum. Presentations were from the Bureaus of Land Management (BLM) and Reclamation (USBR), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), and the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS). BLM updated the group regarding ongoing research in targeted watersheds and that the agency would begin reviewing applications for funding. NRCS presented an overview of Public Law 566 Watershed Program, a source of funding for watershed restoration, flood control, or water supply projects. USBR provided an update on the drought conditions including the condition of Lake Mead and Lake Powell. Both lakes are projected to go into shortage conditions as early as next water year. USBR indicated that the shortage conditions will increase the possibility of water delivery cuts to California in 2023. [Emma McCorkle, ES]

2021 National CWA 303(d) and Data Management Training Workshop: This workshop was organized by the United States Environmental Protection Agency and Environmental Law Institute and took place over four days from June 7 - 10, 2021.

The purpose of the workshop was to provide state and tribal water quality program staff with an opportunity to learn strategies for improving the process and outcomes of Clean Water Act Section 303(d) listing and TMDL programs. One of the objectives of this workshop was to learn about and contribute to the ideas and methods for better incorporating environmental justice and climate change considerations into water quality data management, assessment, and restoration and protection activities. Another objective was to learn and contribute to the process for developing the next iteration of the CWA 303(d) Program Vision. The workshop was organized in breakout sessions with several training presentations followed by discussions. Topics covered were a) techniques for collaborating across jurisdictional boundaries and with other programs, agencies, and organizations, b) develop technical skills in information management, c) learn about tools and approaches for communicating water quality information, d) alternative restoration plans (ARP) and category 5-Alt.[Francisco Costa, ES]

Colorado River Salinity Control Forum Work Group Subcommittee Meetings: A subcommittee for updating the Salinity Economic Impact Model for the 2023 Triennial Review was created and held an inaugural meeting on June 15. A follow-up meeting was held July 19. The purpose of the subcommittee is to gather data and projections from agencies for use in updating the Salinity Economic Impact Model used in determining budget and program achievements. Coachella Valley Environmental Justice Enforcement Task Force, June 23, 2021: The meeting was chaired over Zoom by Miguel Hernandez with Comite Civico del Valle. Other attendees included representatives from South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD), Sen. Melendez Office, Friends of the Desert Mountains, Communities for new California, City of Coachella, California Air Resources Control Board (CARB), Twentynine Palms Band of Mission Indians, Coachella Valley Unified School District, California Department of Pesticide Regulation (CDPR), Salton Sea Action Committee, Coachella Valley Water keeper, Leadership Counsel, Coachella Valley Resources Conservation District, and Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District. CDPR staff gave a presentation to provide background on CDPR's Groundwater Protection Program regulatory sampling programs and provide information on the pilot project for passive sampling of pesticides in groundwater. Salton Sea Management Program (SSMP) Community Engagement Committee, June 29, 2021: Evon Wilhoff with California Department of Water Resources provided an update on the committee charter by going over the revised document. Committee members provided input and comments. Due to limited time, members were given additional time after the meeting to submit their comments by email. Arturo Delgado, CNRA Assistant Secretary for the Salton Sea, went over the SSMP timeline and upcoming NEPA meetings.

Salton Sea Monitoring and Implementation Plan Review Kick-off Meeting: The Monitoring and Implementation Plan (MIP) for projects planned as part of the California Natural Resources Agency (CNRA) is currently being drafted. The agency has contracted Environmental Science Associates (ESA) for the MIP development process. A kick-off meeting was held virtually on July 13 hosted by ESA consultants. An administrative draft has been shared among the review working group which includes federal, local, and state agency representatives as well as community advocacy groups. The group will meet over the next few months to discuss any comments or revisions that should be included to satisfy all stakeholders. The MIP is intended to provide a baseline of current Salton Sea conditions and lay the groundwork for future trend monitoring. It is not intended to provide effectiveness monitoring for the various projects. The first working group meeting is tentatively scheduled for August with meetings in December following the science committee review. The final MIP for public release is planned for January 2022. Coachella Valley Environmental Justice Enforcement Task Force, July 28, 2021: The meeting was chaired over Zoom by Miguel Hernandez with Comite Civico del Valle. Miguel announced that this is his last time chairing the meeting and introduced his replacement, Matthew Maldonado, who is an air monitoring technician with Comite Civico del Valle. Other attendees included representatives from South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD), Sen. Melendez Office, Friends of the Desert Mountains, California Air Resources Control Board (CARB), Torres Martinez Desert Cahuilla Indians, Riverside

County Agricultural Commissioner's Office, Coachella Valley Resource Conservation District, Coachella Valley Unified School District, Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District, Coachella Valley Water keeper, and California Natural Resources Agency. Moises Moreno-Rivera introduced himself as the new CNRA Assistant Secretary for Environmental Justice. CNRA announced a series of upcoming workshops and Secretary speaker series.
