# **EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT**

California Regional Water Quality Control Board Colorado River Basin



October 2021

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The Executive Officer (EO) of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region (Regional Water Board) hereby provides the following report on recent staff activities in the region:

### LAND DISPOSAL – WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS PROGRAM

**Notices of Violation/Noncompliance:** Two (2) Notices of Violation/Noncompliance were issued to Dischargers for violations of Waste Discharge Requirements.

- Barbara Worth Country Club Collection System was issued a Notice of Violation for discharges subject to General Order 2006-0003-DWQ, on October 5, 2021, Holtville, Imperial County. [Reggie Tan, WRCE]
- Notice of Violation for 4955 Neighbors Boulevard, APN 821-200-004, was issued a Notice of Violation for discharges which are subject to General Order 2019-0001-DWQ, October 6, 2021, Blythe, Ca, Riverside County. *[Zak Owens, EG]*

**Notices of Termination:** 19 NOTs were issued to Dischargers for various projects regionwide:

- 18 recycled water users in Coachella Valley Water District's Water Reclamation Plant were issued NOTs on October 6, 2021. The use sites are now regulated under General Order 2016-0068 with CVWD as the administrator. *[Courtney Chin, SA]*
- The City of Blythe's Water Production and Treatment Facility was issued a NOT to terminate enrollment for General Order 2003-0003-DWQ for low threat dischargers on October 19, 2021, Blythe, Riverside County. *[Adriana Godinez, WRCE]*

### UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK (UST) AND SITE CLEANUP PROGRAM (SCP)

Regional Water Board staff continues to work with staff from the Department of Defense (DOD) to expedite ongoing activities at cleanup sites located at military facilities within the Colorado River Basin region. The UST and SCP staff issued correspondence reviewing technical reports, requesting site access, providing direction for site assessment, and approving remedial action plans for sites currently in the assessment and cleanup process. ### SALT AND NUTRIENT MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

On October 4, 2021 the Regional Water Board provided a letter of acceptance for the Coachella Valley Salt and Nutrient Management Plan (SNMP) Development Workplan to the Coachella Valley Stakeholder Group. The Regional Water Board found the SNMP Workplan acceptable.

#### Enforcement Supplemental Environmental Project Update – NCA Management Co., LLC.

During the March 9. 2021 Board Hearing the Colorado River Basin Water Board approved a settlement agreement with NCA Management Co., LLC. (NCA) for \$125,000. NCA is a cannabis cultivation company that operated an indoor grow operation in Needles, CA. The entire amount of the fine was designated for the design and construction of the L Street Booster Station for the City of Needles. The project will improve the water pressure and reliability year-round, but especially during the summer months.

NCA has made the scheduled \$5,208.34 payment monthly as stipulated in the agreement for a total of \$36,458.38 paid to date. The L Street design plans have been completed. The request for bids for construction has been submitted with a deadline for submittal of December 1, 2021. The Categorical Exemption for the project which replaces existing facilities was filed by the City of Needles on October 18, 2021. The City has expensed \$57,888 for the L Street Booster Station project.

### NPDES PROGRAM

**401 Water Quality Certifications (Dredge or Fill Discharge):** No additional certifications were issued in October 2021 other than the waste discharge requirements adopted by the Regional Water Board. *[Kai Dunn, Senior WRCE]*
