## California Regional Water Quality Control Board Colorado River Basin

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The Executive Officer (EO) of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region (Regional Water Board) hereby provides the following report on recent staff activities in the region:

## LAND DISPOSAL - WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS PROGRAM

#### SALT AND NUTRIENT MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

On February 2, 2021 a contract with the United States Geological Survey (USGS) was finalized. The State Water Board signed a \$420,000 contract with USGS on January 14, 2021, to provide services for the Colorado River Basin Region specifically for the collection, compilation, and visualization of groundwater quality data in the Indio Subbasin of the Coachella Valley. The contract is effective through March 2023. The contract focus will be on increasing the understanding of processes affecting groundwater quality in the Indio subbasin of the Coachella Valley groundwater basin. This effort will augment the USGS's 2020 Groundwater Ambient Monitoring Assessment-Priority Basin Project (GAMA-PBP) study in the Coachella Valley to include:

- · additional data collection; and
- data analysis to meet specific informational needs.

Data collected under this Agreement will be published as:

- a USGS Data Release; and
- a fact sheet summarizing the key findings.

On February 21, 2021 Staff issued an approval of the Groundwater Monitoring Program Workplan – Coachella Valley Salt and Nutrient Management Plan Update submitted on December 23, 2020. [Cathy Sanford, Engineering Geologist]

#### CANNABIS ENFORCEMENT

Region 7's Prosecution team has two Administrative Civil Liability Complaints (Complaints) referencing the Cannabis Cultivation General Order which are currently posted on our website and available for public review.

- Lean Green Industries, LLC, 68721 Summit Drive, Cathedral City, Riverside County APN687-162-004-4, WDID No.7 33cc403337
- Paradise Wellness Center, 1 Ice House Road, Needles, San Bernardino County APN0650-391-23, WDID No. 7\_36cc401592

The Dischargers chose to waive the right to a Hearing before the Regional Water Board to engage the Regional Board's Prosecution Team in settlement discussions including the possibility of completing a Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP) and/or Compliance Projects. The Prosecution Team is currently in settlement discussions with the Dischargers.

NCA Management Co., LLC, (NCA) owns and operates an indoor cannabis cultivation facility in Needles California, San Bernardino County Assessor Parcel Number 0660-091-09. A Complaint was issued to NCA on June 5, 2020 and NCA also chose to waive the right to a Hearing and enter settlement discussions. NCA and the Regional Water Board's Prosecution Team concluded discussions with a Settlement Agreement and Stipulation for Entry of Administrative Civil Liability Order; Proposed Order R7-2021-0014. The proposed order includes a Supplemental Environmental Project which will benefit the City of Needles, a financial hardship community. The entire amount of the administrative civil liability \$125,000, will be used to design and partially construct the L Street Booster Station. This project will increase water pressure and reliability in the community during peak demand. The Assistant Executive Officer of the Colorado River Basin Region signed the Order on January 15, 2021 and William A. Sutman, Chief Financial Officer of NCA Management Co., LLC signed on January 18, 2021. The order was posted for public comment from January 19, 2021 through February 18, 2021. No comments were received during the public comment period. The proposed order will be considered at the March 9, 2021 Board Hearing. [Cassandra Owens, CEA]

## **WQSS/NPS UNIT**

### February Colorado River Salinity Forum Work Group Meeting

The Salinity Forum Work Group meeting took place over two days from February 23-24, 2021.

This meeting provided updates on current and upcoming projects within the group. The Executive Director presented the schedule for beginning the Colorado River Salinity 2023 Triennial Review process next year including ongoing modeling efforts by the Bureau of Reclamation. The Work Group Chair then presented progress on the fact sheets in development to provide information about the Colorado River Basin, the Salinity Forum and its benefits, as well as current Colorado River salinity conditions. The federal partner agencies, Bureaus of Reclamation and Land Management, U.S. Geological Survey, and the Natural Resources Conservation Service provided updates on program funding, current salinity control projects, ongoing analysis of seismic events at the Paradox injection site, and changes at the agencies with the transition to the Biden administration. The meeting wrapped up with a request for contributions to the Forum's outside witness testimony that will be sent to relevant Congressional appropriations subcommittees for the FY2022 budget.
