REVISED TENTATIVE WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS (WDRs) AND WATER RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS (WRRs), AND RESPONSE TO COMMENTS FOR CAMROSA WATER DISTRICT, CAMROSA WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY (FILE NO. 54-035, CI-0821)

The Regional Water Board staff has revised the tentative WDRs and WRRs dated December 19, 2014, based on comments received by the January 19, 2015, public comment deadline. A copy of the revised tentative Orders and written responses to all comments received are enclosed. Changes to the tentative WDRs and WRRs appear in strikeout and underline format. Written comments are not being solicited regarding the revised tentative Orders.

The Board will hear any testimony pertinent to these revised tentative Orders. It is expected that the Board will take action at the hearing; however, as testimony indicates, the Board, at its discretion, may order further action by staff.
