Phone: 213-576-6600 Fax: 213-576-6640 On November 20, 2014, the Annual Board of Governor's Meeting was held in San Diego at the Maritime Museum. Chief Deputy EO, Deborah Smith, participated on the Board for Board Member Fran Diamond who was unable to attend. Janelle Beland, Undersecretary for CA Natural Resources Agency chaired the meeting. The Board approved the 2014 Wetlands Recovery Project Work plan and received an update on the Regional Strategy. The Board also approved the members of the Science Advisory Panel and Scope of Work. Many other interesting topics of discussion followed, including Eric Stein's presentation of

his Coastal Change Analysis Report, the relationship of the WRP and the CA Water Quality Monitoring Council, and the issue of Intermittently Open Estuaries in Southern California.

Contaminated Sediments

Review of the Surface Water Ambient Monitoring Program (SWAMP)

The Water Boards assembled a review team in February of 2014 to conduct an internal programmatic review of the Surface Water Ambient Monitoring Program. The purpose of the review was to evaluate SWAMP's program functions and effectiveness and recommend actions to ensure the program's continued success. The final report with findings and recommendations was recently released (posted on State Board's website at: http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/swamp/reports.shtml).

Here are a few of the key findings of the review:

- A robust surface water ambient monitoring program is essential for the Water Boards to achieve their mission.
 Both statewide assessments and regional assessments are needed to provide information at the scales needed by
 the Water Boards and society at large. Statewide assessments provide a "big picture" of the overall status and
 trends of water quality in California, while regional assessments provide the more detailed information needed by
 water regulators and resource managers to detect and fix specific problems.
- 2. Water Board monitoring needs greatly exceed existing resources. SWAMP currently is funded at a small fraction of the originally identified need, and the costs of monitoring increase every year, reducing what can be accomplished with available resources. While SWAMP monitoring provides valuable information on some key issues, many human health and ecological condition issues cannot be addressed with the current level of funding.
- 3. Millions of dollars are spent each year on surface water monitoring for Water Board and other agency programs, but the monitoring is not fully coordinated among programs. Better coordination could provide multiple benefits, but effective coordination is time-consuming and resource intensive. Coordination of all Water Board (and external) monitoring efforts is a laudable goal, and SWAMP has the expertise to perform this function. But the experience gained over the past decade demonstrates that SWAMP cannot effectively fulfill this role without substantial additional staff resources.
- 4. While SWAMP has developed a robust ambient monitoring program over the past fourteen years, improvements can be made. Specific suggestions compiled during the review include: i) establish an annual strategic planning process to align SWAMP's statewide assessments with management priorities and available resources; ii) create a feedback loop for users of SWAMP assessments, data and tools to suggest improvements; and iii) use SWAMP's experience at monitoring and assessment to identify new or improved outcome-based performance measures for the Water Boards.

Key recommendations include: i) maintaining the SWAMP focus on ambient monitoring as its core function; ii) establishing a process to compile coordination needs, set priorities and deliberate options for accomplishing the highest priority coordination tasks; iii) promoting question-driven science to answer key management questions; and iv) updating the SWAMP strategic plan to evaluate, and adjust as appropriate, the objectives and priorities for SWAMP's statewide ambient assessments.

Watershed Management

Watershed Coordinator

The Watershed Coordinator participated in a meeting of the Ventura River Watershed Council on December 11; the Council serves as one of the Watersheds Coalition of Ventura County's Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) committees. Also attended was a Watersheds Coalition general membership meeting on January 8.

The Wetlands Recovery Project (WRP) and its committees and workgroups are represented at staff level by the Watershed Coordinator. Staff level representatives from the participating agencies in the WRP provide input on activities of interest to the WRP at Managers Group meetings; the most recent were held on December 3 and January 7. The Governing Board of the WRP met on November 20 in San Diego to adopt an updated workplan and hear presentations on technical work being undertaken.

Groundwater Permitting and Land Disposal Program

<u>Updates for Malibu Civic Center Wastewater Treatment Facility Construction</u> Don Tsai

On December 15, 2014, the Regional Board Executive Officer and staff attended the Malibu Planning Commission Meeting held by the City of Malibu (City) regarding the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) Public Hearing for the Malibu Civic Center Wastewater Treatment Facility (Civic Center Facility). The Malibu Planning Commission unanimously adopted two Resolutions:

- 1. To approve a Local Coastal Program Amendment for amending the Local Coastal Program Local Implementation Plan to incorporate the Civic Center Facility Institutional Overlay District; and,
- 2. To approve the final EIR for construction of Phase I of the Civic Center Facility project for City Council's consideration. Subsequently, the final EIR was certified by the City Council on January 12, 2015.

On January 8, 2015, Regional Board staff attended the fifth Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) Meeting, held by the City regarding the implementation of the Malibu Onsite Wastewater Disposal System (OWDS) Prohibition. Other attendees included Dr. Richard Laton, and Dr. Michael Stenstrom, Heal the Bay, State Water Resources Control Board, other resource agencies and interested parties. The following updates were discussed during TAC Meeting:

- 1. Civic Center Facility Design: The Civic Center Facility design including wastewater collection pipeline system, recycled water delivery system, and injection wells is 99% complete.
- 2. Tentative Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) and Water Recycling Requirements (WRRs) and Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) for Civic Center Facility: Regional Board staff presented the tentative WDRs and WRRs, including effluent, recycled water and groundwater limits, recycled water application requirements, and MRP for effluents, groundwater in the Civic Center area, and surface water in Santa Monica Bay, Malibu Creek and Lagoon. The tentative permit was released for public comment on December 31, 2014 with the comment deadline of January 30, 2015. The tentative permit is scheduled for the Regional Board Hearing on March 12, 2015.

Glenview Mobile Home Park

On November 7, 2013, the Groundwater Permitting Unit was notified by Ventura County Environmental Health Division of a discharge of sewage from Glenview Mobile Home Park located at 3438 Siesta Way, Oxnard. On November 15, 2013, staff conducted an inspection and found that the onsite wastewater treatment systems at the site were failing and raw sewage was ponding outside the property. After several attempts of delivering the California Water Code (CWC) section 13260 directives on August 8 and September 22, 2014 via certified mails, on October 7, 2014, the Regional Board delivered the CWC section 13260 directive via Ace Attorney Services.

On November 21, 2014, the Regional Board received Report of Waste Discharge (ROWD) application. Staff reviewed the ROWD and deemed it incomplete.

On December 22, 2014, Ventura County Environmental Health notified staff of another complaint for sewer overflow at Glenview Mobile Home Park. On December 23, 2014, staff met with Park Manager, staff of the California Department of Housing and Community Development; and representatives of the Ventura County Environmental Health, and conducted an investigation in response to the complaint. Based on the observations, Regional Board staff will take appropriate enforcement actions for corrective actions.

Compliance and Enforcement Program

NPDES Facility Inspections:

The Enforcement Unit NPDES inspector conducted inspections at 21 facilities with NPDES Permits. Inspection of these facilities is a required part of the NPDES program.

Stormwater Facility Inspections:

The Stormwater Unit inspectors conducted inspections at 103 facilities with Construction and Industrial Stormwater Permits. Inspection of these facilities is a required part of the Stormwater program.

13267 Request for Information:

• Investigative Order No. R4-2014-0181 was issued to the Tesoro Refining and Marketing Company LLC on October 13, 2014 for information related to the discharge of wastewater and sewage to land. The discharger responded to the Investigative Order by the November 13 deadline.

- Investigative Order No. R4-2014-0121 was issued to the City of Industry on October 24, 2014 for information related to the grading and construction activity that may pose a threat to water quality. The discharger responded to the Investigative Order by the November 24, deadline.
- Investigative Order No. R4-2014-0219 was issued to Asioco, Inc., on November 24, 2014 for information related to oil and gas activities that may pose a threat to water quality from the discharge of stormwater exposed to crude oil. The discharger responded to the Investigative Order by the December 24, 2014 deadline.
- Investigative Order No. R4-2014-0207 was issued to the Ventura County Special Districts on December 11, 2014 for information related to the unpermitted discharge of raw sewage on October 17, 2014 in or around North Isle Drive and East Vistapark Drive. The discharger failed to respond by the January 12, 2014 deadline.

Stipulated Orders:

- Stipulated Order on Settlement Offer No. R4-2014-0124 was issued to Bragg Investment Co., Inc. (Permittee) on October 6, 2014 in the amount of \$1,500 for failing to submit the 2010-2011 stormwater annual report. The Regional Board has not received payment to date.
- Stipulated Order on Settlement Offer No. R4-2014-0095 was issued to California Domestic Water Company (Permittee) on November 10, 2014 in the amount of \$1,500 for failing to submit the 2010-2011 stormwater annual report. On December 8, 2014 the Regional Board received payment in full.
- Stipulated Order on Settlement Offer No. R4-2014-0096 was issued to Mt. San Antonio College (Permittee) on November 10, 2014 in the amount of \$1,500 for failing to submit the 2012-2013 stormwater annual report. On October 22, 2014 the Regional Board received payment in full.
- Stipulated Order on Settlement Offer No. R4-2014-0093 was issued to the Double Tree by Hilton Hotel (Permittee) on November 10, 2014 in the amount of \$1,500 for failing to submit the 2012-2013 stormwater annual report. On December 1, 2014 the Regional Board received payment in full.
- Stipulated Order on Settlement Offer No. R4-2014-0171 was issued to Omega Precision (Permittee) on November 18, 2014 in the amount of \$1,500 for failing to submit the 2010-2011 stormwater annual report. On December 29, 2014 the Regional Board received payment in full.
- Stipulated Order on Settlement Offer No. R4-2014-0058 was issued to the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works (Permittee) on November 18, 2014 in the amount of \$2,500 for failing to submit the 2011-2012 and the 2012-2013 stormwater annual reports. On December 19, 2014 the Regional Board received payment in full.
- Stipulated Order on Settlement Offer No. R4-2014-0178 was issued to the City of Cerritos (Permittee) on December 11, 2014 in the amount of \$30,000 for alleged effluent violations of the NPDES Permit for the Cerritos Civic Center Parking Facility. The Permittee has until January 12, 2015 to submit payment.
- Stipulated Order on Settlement Offer No. R4-2014-0126 was issued to Pacific Rock Inc., (Permittee) on December 22, 2014 in the amount of \$1,500 for failing to submit the 2010-2011 stormwater annual report. On October 30, 2014 the Regional Board received payment in full.

Administrative Civil Liabilities:

Settlement Offer No. R4-2014-0206 was issued to Owens-Illinois, Inc. (Permittee) on December 8, 2014 in the amount of \$93,000 for alleged effluent violations of the NPDES Permit for the Owens-Brockway Glass Container, Inc. facility. The Permittee failed to respond to the January 7, 2015 deadline.

Notices of Non-Compliance:

One hundred forty-five (145) Notices of Non-Compliance (NNCs) were issued during the November through December 2014 period to industrial facilities for failing to submit the FY 2013-2014 annual report that was due on July 1, 2014.

Stormwater Program

Storm Water Permitting Watershed Management Plan Activities

Ivar Ridgeway

Staff participated in 5 significant meetings in the month of January 2015. On January 6, 2015, staff met with the Upper Santa Clara River Watershed Group regarding their Coordinated Integrated Monitoring Program and their soon to be submitted Enhanced Watershed Management Program. On January 6, 2015, staff met with the Ballona Creek Watershed Group regarding their Coordinated Integrated Monitoring Program and their requested Time Schedule Order (TSO) to implement the dry weather Waste Load Allocations (WLAs) established in the Total Maximum Daily Load for Bacteria in Ballona Creek, Ballona Estuary, and Sepulveda Channel. On January 7, 2015, staff met with the County of Los Angeles and Los Angeles County Flood Control District to discuss implementation of the LA County MS4 Permit, including implementation of trash TMDL requirements in rural areas. On January 13, 2015, staff met with the East San Gabriel River Watershed Group regarding their Coordinated Integrated Monitoring Program and their Watershed Management Program. On January 15, 2015, staff met with the Alamitos Bay/Los Cerritos Channel Watershed Group regarding their Coordinated Integrated Monitoring Program are currently finalizing their Watershed Management Programs for approval. In addition to the meetings noted, Storm Water Permitting staff have reviewed and provided written comments on a number of the draft integrated and coordinated integrated monitoring programs.

Remediation

Former Kast Tank Farm Property, Carousel Residential Neighborhood Tract, Carson

Dr. Teklewold Ayalew

The activities related to the site investigation and cleanup work performed during the months of November, December 2014 and January 2015 include the following:

- On November 5, 2014, the Regional Board received the letter titled Transfer of Turco Monitoring Well MW-16.
 The letter also provided the well transfer ownership agreement from former Turco Products Facility to Shell. Because there already exists a monitoring well designated as MW-16 installed at the Former Kast Property, Turco well MW-16 has been renamed MW-18 to avoid confusion with the Kast well MW-16.
- On November 7, 2014, the Regional Board issued Notice of Completion (NOC) of a Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and Notice of Availability (NOA) for Public Comment for a period of November 7, 2014 through January 9, 2015.
- 3. On November 12, 15, 18, and 20, 2014, the Regional Board held a series of neighborhood block/community meetings (total 6 meetings) and discussed the contents of the Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and the proposed Remedial Action Plan (RAP). The Regional Board staff answered questions raised at the meeting and encouraged residents to also review the documents and submit comments on the EIR and RAP.
- 4. On November 22, 2014, the Regional Board conducted a general meeting that informed the public and other stakeholders about the project significant environmental effects and ways to reduce them, as required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
- The Draft EIR describes and evaluates the potential environmental impacts associated with implementation of the proposed Remedial Action Plan (RAP). The Draft EIR evaluates potential impacts with regard to air quality, geology and soils, greenhouse gas emissions, hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, noise and vibration, transportation and circulation, and utilities and service systems (solid waste). Based on the analysis contained in the Draft EIR, implementation of the RAP would result in significant and unavoidable noise and vibration impacts.

All meetings were held at the Carson Community Center.

- 5 On November 25, 2014, the Regional Board and OEHHA staff completed the review of four (4) *Final Interim Residential Sampling Reports* and the Regional Board issued a directive for a follow-up action.
- 6. On December 8, 2014, the Regional Board issued Tentative Revised Cleanup and Abatement Order R4-2011-0046 (2011 CAO). The Tentative CAO would add Barclay Hollander Corporation as a responsible party to the 2011 CAO. The Regional Board staff considered comments received regarding a *Proposed Draft Revised CAO* issued on October 31, 2013, for public comment.
- . The Regional Board staff has prepared a memo to Deborah Smith, Chief Deputy Executive Officer of the Regional Board, recommending that she issue the Tentative Revised CAO naming Barclay Hollander Corporation.
- 7. On December 24, 2014, the Regional Board received a response letter to the Tentative Revised Cleanup and Abatement Order No. R4-2011-0046 for the Former Kast Property Tank Farm, prepared by Gibson, Dunn and Crutcher LLP, on behalf of Dole Food Company. The letter claims of substantial additional and critical evidence since Barclay's last technical report and, deposition and declaration submitted.
- 8. On December 30, 2014, the Regional Board received the 7th Quarterly Methane Monitoring Report: Methane Mitigation System at Single Family Residence at 378 East 249th Street. Three monthly monitoring events and six quarterly monitoring events have previously been completed and reported for the methane mitigation system installed at the above referenced single family residence. During the monitoring of this reporting period, no levels of methane gas were found in ambient air inside the house or garage or in any of the vent risers. The methane mitigation system is op-

erating as intended and the methane posed no hazard during the monitoring event.

- 9. January 9, 2015: In compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the Regional Board prepared a draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR). The Draft EIR describes and evaluates the potential environmental impacts associated with implementation of the proposed Remedial Action Plan (RAP). It describes existing conditions in the project area, analyzing the project's significant environmental effects, and identifying measures to avoid, reduce, or mitigate significantly adverse environmental impacts of the remedial process. The areas of potential impacts include air quality, geology and soils, greenhouse gas emissions, hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, noise and vibration, transportation and circulation, and utilities and service systems (solid waste).
 - The draft EIR was issued on November 7, 2014 for a 45-day public review period that ended on January 9, 2015. Upon completion of the comment period, the Regional Board staff will prepare a response to comments on the draft EIR and a regulatory review of the proposed RAP will be issued.
- 10. Using Regional Board approved methods, soil, soil vapor, and indoor air sampling are performed at individual residential properties as access became available. The completed residential sampling activity as of December 9, 2014 is as follows:
 - 271 homes have been screened for methane (95%);
 - 272 homes have had soils sampled and vapor probes installed (95%);
 - 272 homes have had sub-slab soil vapor probes sampled (95%);
 - 260 homes have had indoor air sampled (91%); and
 - 244 of 260 total have had 2nd round of indoor air sampled (94%)
 - 86% of Total Homes in the Carousel Community have had a 2nd Round of Indoor Air conducted.

<u>Former Athens Tank Farm / Ujima and Earvin Magic Johnson Regional Park, Los Angeles</u> Dr. Teklewold Ayalew

The activities related to the environmental site investigation of the Former Athens Tank Farm during the months of November and December 2014 and January 2015 are summarized as follows:

- 1. On November 13, 2014, the Regional Board issued a directive titled Modification to Off-Site Monthly Methane Monitoring Program. Based on the results of the six monthly monitoring events at the 12802 Keene Avenue property performed since April 2014, methane concentration trends are steady and concentrations are below the screening level. Therefore, the directive modified the monitoring frequency from monthly to quarterly.
- 2. On November 15, 2014, the Regional Board received Monthly Off-Site Methane Monitoring Report October 2014. The report presents the results of monthly methane monitoring of residential crawl spaces performed at 12802 Keene Avenue and provides discussion of efforts to obtain access to 12803 Keene Avenue, located south of the former Athens Tank Farm.
- 3. On November 20, 2014, the Regional Board received a copy of document titled *Start-up Monitoring Results Data* required by South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) application number, prepared for ExxonMobil Oil Corporation by Kleinfelder, Inc. The soil vapor extraction (SVE) system start-up data contains a summary of system operating data, initial start-up monitoring results and a summary of permit emissions.
 - The SVE system start-up activities were completed and the system has been operating on a full time basis since October 20, 2014. The Regional Board intends to host an open house of the Remediation Compound for the benefit of the community and other stakeholders, tentatively scheduled for early January 2015. As per the Regional Board directive, a report of completion will be submitted 60 days after the start-up date.
- 4. On November 26, 2014, the Regional Board received a copy of document titled *Start-up Monitoring Results Data* required by Condition number 24 for South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) application, prepared for ExxonMobil Oil Corporation by Kleinfelder, Inc. The SVE system began operation on October 13, 2014. The soil vapor extraction (SVE) system start-up data contains a summary of system operating data, initial start-up monitoring results and a summary of permit emissions.

- 5. On December 12, 2014, the Regional Board received residential air quality investigation reports for 1104 East 125th Street and 1118 East 123rd Street. The work reported consisted of a second-round of air quality investigation at these homes to assess potential seasonal variability. On January 8, 2015, the Regional Board staff completed the review and determined that the data reported do not warrant additional air quality investigation and/or interim actions at this time.
- 6. On December 19, 2014, the Regional Board received a letter titled *Proposed Revisions to Soil Gas Monitoring and Sampling Program* (letter). This letter includes a summary of the current soil gas monitoring program at the former Athens Tank Farm (Site) and provides rationale for proposed revisions to the monitoring program that includes a reduction in the number of points monitored and the frequency of monitoring. On January 13, 2015, the Regional Board staff completed the review of the revisions and prepared a response pending management approval.
- 7. On January 28, 2015, the Regional Board and DTSC will visit the Remediation Compound. Construction of the Phase I Soil Vapor Extraction (SVE) remediation system is complete. This cleanup system includes a vacuum blower and two internal combustion engines (permitted through the South Coast Air Quality Management District) that are designed to pull soil vapor from SVE wells located in the eastern area of the site. All cleanup equipment is housed within metal containers and kept in an onsite structure enclosed by a double-fence for system security and noise reduction. The SVE system start-up activities were completed and the system has been operating on a full time basis since October 20, 2014. As per the Regional Board directive, a report of completion will be submitted 60 days after the start-up date.
- 8. The Regional Board and DTSC identified 38 off-site properties for air quality testing and began reaching out to these property owners for permission to conduct sampling on their properties in 2011. The Regional Water Board and DTSC have made several attempts to contact these homeowners since ordering ExxonMobil to conduct this sampling. This included letters and community meetings as well as two requests by DTSC to lawyers representing several of the homeowners requesting access for air sample collection (the most recent being May 21, 2014). To date, only seven homeowners out of the 38 off-site identified properties have responded and granted permission for the sampling.
 - Two rounds of air-quality testing were completed in 2012-13 at seven of the off-site residences and the results indicate that while some chemicals were present, they are consistent with background levels in the environment; vapors were not accumulating at levels of concern, and did not pose a health risk or safety hazard
- 9. Upcoming activities include operation of the Phase I SVE cleanup equipment and planning of the next phase of cleanup. The Regional Board and DTSC continue to work in partnership on the environmental investigation and cleanup activities, and will also work in concert with the Los Angeles County Parks and Recreation as they begin their plan to update and revitalize Magic Johnson Park.

For the case closure sites above, a total of **4,127** tons of impacted soils were excavated and **384,604** pounds of hydrocarbons were removed by soil vapor extraction system. In addition, **4,062,503** gallons of groundwater were treated and **109** gallons of free product were removed.

Executive Officer issued General Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Yue Rong

During this reporting period, the Executive Officer issued 3 General Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) to Mobil Station #18-MPL, located in Lakewood (12/3/2014), Arco Station #6169, located in Carson (12/10/2014), and Golden State Water Company, located in Hawthorne (1/6/2015). The WDRs issued for injection of oxygen generating compounds to the impacted aquifer for in-situ groundwater treatment, which, comparing with ex-situ treatment, has advantage to save water resources by avoiding discharging the treated water to the ocean.

General Permitting Activity

Summary of General Permitting Unit Activities for July to September 2013

During the months of October through December 2014, 37 dischargers were enrolled under the general NPDES permits and 17 enrollments were terminated. The table on the following page shows the breakdown of the enrollments and terminations for each category of general NPDES permit during the period.

Summary of General Permitting Unit Activities for Oct—Dec 2014

During the months of October through December 2014, 37 dischargers were enrolled under the general NPDES permits, one enrollment was revised, and 17 enrollments were terminated. Santa Clara River Lakes Nutrient TMDL

In 1998, Santa Clara River Lakes (Lake Elizabeth, Munz Lake, and Lake Hughes) were listed on the Clean Water Act Section 303(d) list as having nutrient-related impairments. Lake Elizabeth was listed for having eutrophic, dissolved oxygen, and pH impairments; Munz Lake was listed as eutrophic; and Lake Hughes was listed for eutrophic, fish kills, algae, and odor impairments. Staff is currently developing a TMDL to address these listings and has completed sampling at the three lakes, and has worked with Tetratech to provide information needed to complete modeling. The Santa Clara River Lakes Nutrients TMDL will apply the Nutrient Numeric Endpoint (NNE) Framework by assessing numeric endpoints and modeling to translate narrative water quality objectives. Staff is planning to bring this item to the Board this fiscal year.

San Gabriel River and its Tributaries Indicator Bacteria TMDL

A draft TMDL for Bacterial Indicator Densities in San Gabriel and its tributaries will be released in 2015 for public review and comment. Ten waterbodies in the San Gabriel River watershed are listed on the 2010 303 (d) list as impaired due to bacteria. The TMDL will address the high frequency of exceedance of bacteria water quality objectives in these waterbodies. In developing the TMDL, Regional Board staff has solicited data from the Council for Watershed Health (CWH), Los Angeles County Department of Public Works, Los Angeles County Sanitation District (LACSD), and Southern California Coastal Water Research Project (SCCWRP). These data, along with other data currently at the Regional Board and any data made available by stakeholders will be analyzed by Regional Board staff to determine the source(s) and their respective loads.

Nonpoint Source Program

Conditional Waiver for Irrigated Lands Program (Order No R4-2010-0186)

On October 7, 2010, the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board renewed a Conditional Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements for Dischargers from Irrigated Lands (Order No. R4-2010-0186). The Conditional Waiver requires agricultural operators (dischargers) to enroll irrigated agriculture property under the waiver in order to continue discharging waste to waters of the state. Agricultural operators may enroll as an individual discharger or as a member of a discharger group.

The Regional Board staff are currently focusing their efforts on outreach to increase enrollment. We have increased field visits to determine the status of irrigated agricultural parcels which are not currently enrolled in the program and which have previously received a "Notice to Enroll" and/or a "Notice of Violation". The Regional Board staff have also been working with the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) to get more of their tenants to enroll in the Conditional Waver. The LADWP staff are very close to sending letters to their tenants and we are confident that this operation will result in increased enrollment. Last year, as a result of a similar partnership with Southern California Edison, enrollment in Los Angeles County increased by 44%. Finally, over the past two months , the Regional Board staff has been planning for increased enforcement actions this year to require dischargers to comply with the Order.
