State Revolving Fund Loan Program Priority List

WHEREAS, The State Water Resources Control Board manages the State Revolving Fund Loan Program to provide loans to communities for: 1) construction of, and improvements to municipal wastewater collection, treatment, and disposal facilities; and 2) nonpoint source, storm drainage pollution, and estuary enhancement projects to eliminate threats to public health; and

WHEREAS, The State Water Resources Control Board requires the California Regional Water Quality Control Boards to provide recommendations for State Revolving Fund Program projects priorities; and

WHEREAS, The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region has received requests from the following communities or their representatives for inclusion on the State Revolving Fund Loan Program Priority List;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region, recommends the following additions and/or modifications to the Fiscal Year 2005-06 State Revolving Fund Priority List:

Priority Class A – Projects to alleviate existing or potential public health problems:

Garberville Sanitary District – I/I Reduction.

Tulelake, City of – Wastewater Treatment Facility upgrades, I/I correction and land disposal.
