STATE REVOLVING FUND LOAN PROGRAM PRIORITY LIST

WHEREAS, the State Water Resources Control Board manages the State Revolving Fund Loan Program to provide loans to communities for: 1) construction of, and improvements to, municipal wastewater collection, treatment, and disposal facilities; and 2) nonpoint source, storm drainage pollution, and estuary enhancement projects to eliminate threats to public health; and

WHEREAS, the State Water Resources Control Board requires the California Regional Water Quality Control Boards to provide recommendations for State Revolving Fund Program project priorities; and

WHEREAS, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region has received requests from the following communities or their representatives for inclusion on the State Revolving Fund Loan Program Priority List:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region, recommends the following additions and/or modifications to the Fiscal Year 2003-04 State Revolving Fund Priority List:

Priority Class A -- Projects to alleviate existing or potential public health problems:

Priority Class B -- Projects to comply with water quality objectives for an impaired water body:

None

Priority Class C -- Projects to comply with waste discharge requirements and water recycling projects:

City of Arcata – increase funding for infiltration/inflow correction (existing project on current priority list, Project No. 4464-11)

Calpella Community Water District – decrease funding for treatment facility upgrade (existing project on current priority list, Project 4254-11)

City of Cloverdale – (1) increase funding for infiltration/inflow correction (existing project on current priority list, Project No. 4697-11); (2) treatment facility upgrade to advanced waste treatment for water recycling

Covelo Community Services District – treatment facility upgrade; infiltration/inflow correction

City of Ferndale – treatment facility upgrade to comply with NPDES permit and Basin Plan waste discharge restrictions; infiltration/inflow correction

City of Fort Bragg – (1) treatment facility upgrades; (2) effluent filter construction to comply with CDO No. R1-2002-25; (3) force main replacement; (4) infiltration/inflow correction

Garberville Sanitary District – (1) additional treatment facility capacity to provide for growth; (2) delete Project No. 4700-11, Class C, interceptor relocation

Gualala Community Services District – Collection system extension and treatment facility expansion

Loleta Community Services District – treatment facility upgrade; land disposal; infiltration/inflow correction

McKinleyville Community Services District – delete Project No. 48222-11, Class C, final polishing treatment wetland

Mendocino City Community Services District – (1) Sludge handling facilities upgrade; (2) SCADA system installation; (3) lift station modifications; (4) water reclamation system expansion

Mendocino County Water Works District No. 2 – infiltration/inflow correction

City of Point Arena – Percolation pond expansion; infiltration/inflow correction

City of Rio Dell – treatment facility upgrade, land disposal; infiltration/inflow correction

City of Tulelake – treatment facility upgrade; land disposal facilities; infiltration/inflow correction

City of Ukiah – treatment facility improvements; water reclamation

Westport Community Water District – treatment facility upgrade
