This Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) is issued pursuant to California Water Code Section (CWC) 13267(b) and requires monitoring and submission of technical reports. The objective of monitoring is to provide the Discharger and the Regional Water Board with: information concerning water quality; determine compliance with the Regional Water Board's Waiver Policy, and; if operations conform to the Discharger's Report of Waste Discharge.

Under the authority of CWC Section 13267, the Discharger is required to comply with the following:

MONITORING

In a tabular Format report the following:

Olive Tonnage Received:	Beginning September 15 of each year
Report Products Produced excepting Olive Oil:	Calendar Year
Tons of Pomace Produced and Disposal Location	Beginning September 15 of each year
Gallons of Waste Water Produced	Beginning September 15 of each year

Land Disposal

In a tabular format report the following for each day of irrigation with process water:

Date of Irrigation	Daily
Gallons Irrigated	Daily
Time; Beginning and End	Daily when irrigating
Application rate gallons/acre or inches per day	Daily
Supplemental irrigation (yes/no)	Gallons
Daily rainfall	Daily during month of irrigation
Daily inspection results for irrigation runoff	Daily when irrigating

Provide a map of all areas irrigated during the year.

Waste Water

Samples of Waste Water shall be analyzed for the following prior to the irrigation season:

Biochemical Oxygen Demand
Electrical Conductivity
All forms of Nitrogen
Sodium Absorption Ratio

Ground Water Monitoring

Every three years Well #1 and Well #2 shall be sampled for compounds listed in Appendix I, of the August 210 revision to the Report of Waste Discharge.

Spill Notification

All spills and offsite discharges from irrigation shall be reported to the Regional Water Board within 2 hours of becoming aware of the discharge. Information to be provided includes a detailed description of the incident and cleanup actions.

Reporting

Annual reports for the previous year shall be submitted to the Regional Water Quality Control Board by September 15 of each year. The report will include:

1. Tabular reporting of all information.
2. A discussion of the facility's compliance with the Waiver Policy, compliance with the Report of Waste Discharge, and all actions taken or planned to bring the facility into compliance.
3. A complete list of chemical and cleaning products used at the facility.
