RESCISSION OF CLEANUP AND ABATEMENT ORDER NO. 85-87

For

POINT ST. GEORGE FISHERIES
8 Sebastopol Avenue
Santa Rosa, CA

Sonoma County

1. On May 28, 1985, the Executive Officer of the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board issued Cleanup and Abatement Order Number 85-87 (CAO 85-87) for the cleanup of discharges from seafood processing and vehicle maintenance facilities at the property formerly identified as 8 Sebastopol Avenue in Santa Rosa, California (Site). The waste discharges identified in CAO 85-87 include oil and petroleum; solvents, thinners and other toxic or hazardous materials; and wastewater containing organic materials, brine, and metals. CAO 85-87 required the Discharger to cease the waste discharges, investigate the magnitude and extent of impacts in groundwater and soil, and clean up the Site.
2. Cleanup and abatement activities conducted by the Discharger include the demolition and removal of all operations facilities, including underground fuel storage tanks, and the off-site disposal of approximately 5,100 tons of excavated soil.
3. Site investigations conducted on behalf of the Discharger, and inspections by Santa Rosa Fire Department and Regional Water Board staffs, confirm the completion of the required cleanup activities. Based on the available information, CAO 85-87 is no longer needed.

THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered that CAO 85-87 is rescinded.
