Notification

The discharger shall notify the Regional Water Board in writing at least two weeks in advance of the anticipated first day of seasonal operation each year.

Monitoring

1. The discharger shall determine and record the waste flow in gallons per day discharged from the winery to the waste treatment facilities on a daily basis.
2. The discharger shall determine and record monthly the maximum and average waste flow in gallons per day discharged to the waste treatment facilities.
3. The discharger shall determine monthly the depth of wastewater and remaining freeboard in the treatment/holding pond.
4. The discharger shall determine monthly the dissolved oxygen concentration in the treatment/holding pond.
5. The discharger shall record monthly the location and volume of solid waste (pomace, stems, seeds, lees, etc.) in temporary storage or description of solid waste disposal method.
6. The discharger shall sample contents of the storage pond monthly when irrigation is anticipated. The sample shall be analyzed for the following:

Constituent	Units	Type of Sample
BOD (20oC, 5-day)	mg/l	grab
Settleable Matter	ml/l	grab
Nonfilterable Residue	mg/l	grab

7. The discharger shall determine and record the treated wastewater flows in gallons per day discharged to the disposal facilities for the reporting period.
8. The discharger shall determine and record the land area, in square feet, that was used for effluent disposal for the reporting period.
9. The discharger shall report any irrigation run off to surface waters or to property not under the control of the discharger. The report shall include run off in gallons and duration of the event for the reporting period.

Reporting

Monitoring reports shall be submitted to the Regional Water Board on a monthly basis, by the 15th day of the following month. The monitoring reports shall be arranged in such a manner so that the data is clearly illustrated. During periods of no discharge, the reports shall indicate no discharge. Analytical results that exceed permit limits require an explanation.
