Rescission of Cleanup and Abatement Order Nos. 88-147 and 88-104

for

USA Gasoline Station #206  
1301 North State Street  
Ukiah, California  
Case No. 1TMC013

Mendocino County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region (hereinafter the Regional Water Board), finds that:

1. USA Petroleum (hereinafter the discharger) owns and operates USA Gasoline Station #206 located at 1301 North State Street, in the city of Ukiah (hereinafter the site). On or before June 4, 1986, the discharger caused or permitted the discharge of unknown quantities of petroleum hydrocarbons to the soil and groundwater.
2. A hydrogeological investigation has been performed with boring and monitoring wells to define the limits of the petroleum contamination. Four underground storage tanks located at the site and presently in operation were upgraded in May 1997. Over-excavation of impacted soil around the underground tanks and from the most northern pump island was completed on June 5, 1997. Analytical results of onsite soil and groundwater samples have demonstrated nondetectable or near nondetectable levels of petroleum hydrocarbons.
3. Cleanup and abatement activities related to the discharge from the underground storage tank as specified in Order Nos. 88-147 and 88-104 have been completed.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Cleanup and Abatement Order Nos. 88-147 and 88-104 be rescinded.
