

Mandatory Closure Agreement

Pacific Resources is a Santa Rosa company which provides receiving and transport services for non-hazardous liquid wastes. In order to be a reliable service provider, the company has developed a wide range of contingency plans to prevent any interruption in this service. Helpful in this regard, the receiving facility is closed more hours than it is open, allowing up to 15 hours per working day or 48 hours during weekends to repair or otherwise resolve issues which might arise.

However, some issues cannot be resolved by the efforts of on-site personnel. Among these conditions but not limited to them are:

- 1) Closure of EBMUD to out-of-area haulers. Closure may be avoided if another receiving facility is located before the closure of EBMUD.
- 2) Cancellation of Pacific Resources' EBMUD dumping permit. Cancellation may be avoided if another receiving facility and permit is obtained before the EBMUD cancellation.
- 3) Extended highway closure preventing the necessary movement of company trucks..
- 4) Fuel supply emergency. (National Emergency)
- 5) Extreme act of vandalism.
- 6) Suspension or non-renewal of any required city, county or state license or permit.

Under these conditions, all listed customers will be notified, all arriving waste haulers will be turned away and the facility will be closed.
