SUBJECT: Rescission of Waste Discharge Requirements, Order Nos. 88-145, 88-70, R1-2001-0104, and 83-59.

DISCUSSION

This Order to rescind Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) was initiated at the request of the dischargers, American Aircraft Painting, Thomas N. Jordan, Jr. dba Jordan Vineyards and Winery, the former Old Woolen Mill, and Kaiser Sand and Gravel Windsor #1. This Order will rescind four WDRs that are no longer needed.

On December 1, 1988, the Regional Water Board adopted Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs), Order No. 88-145, requiring American Aircraft Painting to comply with discharge prohibitions and effluent limitations for activities associated with the stripping and removal of paint. The owner has requested that Order No. 88-145 be rescinded because the facility is no longer in operation.

On May 25, 1988, the Regional Water Board adopted WDR, Order No. 88-70, requiring Thomas N. Jordan Jr. dba Jordan Vineyard and Winery to comply with discharge prohibitions and effluent limitations for the treatment and discharge of a combined waste stream that included both domestic waste and winery waste into reclaimed water irrigation. The owner has requested that Order No. 88-70 be rescinded because the facility is now enrolled under general permits.

On August 23, 2001 the Regional Water Board adopted Order No. R1-2001-0104, requiring the Old Woolen Mill facility to comply with discharge prohibitions and effluent limitations for the treatment, discharge, and onsite reuse of soils contaminated with petroleum hydrocarbons, chromium, lead, and zinc at their facility in Eureka, California. On December 10, 2007 the Old Woolen Mill site was recommended for case closure. On October 21, 2008 Regional Board Staff requested rescission of WDRs because all onsite operations have ceased, and Order No. R1-2001-0104 is no longer needed for the protection of water quality.

On May 26, 1983 the Regional Water Board adopted Order No.83-059 requiring the Kaiser Sand and Gravel facility to comply with discharge prohibitions and effluent limitations for the treatment and discharge of waste from sand and gravel crushing, screening, and washing operations adjacent to the Russian River at their facility in

Healdsburg, California. The owner has requested that Order No. 83-059 be rescinded because the facility is no longer in operation

A copy of the draft rescission was mailed to interested parties and a 30 day public comment period was noticed on the Regional Water Board website from July 13 to August 13, 2009. No public comments were received; this item is non-controversial.
