

Russian River Watershed


 1,485 square miles, ~1 million acres of forests, agricultural and urban lands in Mendocino & Sonoma Counties

- Two major reservoirs
- Main stem flows 110 miles from Redwood Valley and Potter Valley headwaters to the Pacific Ocean near Jenner
- 238 streams and creeks, and 63 species of fish
- Home to approximately 360,000 people
- 10 Tribal Lands Organizations

- Vertical integration connect technical staff expertise and regional actions with decision maker forums







- Provides information about Integrated Pest Management (IPM) to consumers in nurseries and hardware stores in the watershed.


- COVID safe webinars



Russian River-Friendly Landscape Guidelines








Drought Response Support
