6. Update on SB 200 and the Safe and Affordable Funding for Equity and Resilience (SAFER) Drinking Water program. Darrin Polhemus, Deputy Director, State Water Board Division of Drinking Water, gave the history and background and introduced Michelle Frederick, Supervising Engineer, State Water Board Division of

Drinking Water, who gave an update on SB 200 and the Safe and Affordable Funding for Equity and Resilience (SAFER) Drinking Water program. Board member Bedolla asked about financial assistance for upgrading water systems, financial help to small disadvantaged communities, and the impacts from the Sonoma County fires to the individual water systems. Chair Quinto asked if there will be financial support for individual and domestic well owners impacted by fires. Staff provided respondes.

- 4. **Update on Cannabis Cultivation Waste Discharge Regulatory Program** Activities in the North Coast Region. Kason Grady, Division Chief, Cannabis & Enforcement Division, introduced Mona Dougherty, Senior, Northern Cannabis Unit; David Kuszmar, Senior, Southern Cannabis Unit; and Jonathan Bishop, Chief Deputy Director, State Water Board. Ms. Dougherty updated the Board on the scale of cannabis cultivation in California, the North Coast region, and the water quality threats from cannabis cultivation. Chief Deputy Director Bishop updated the Board on the Statewide Cannabis funding shortfalls, staffing reductions, and the Executive guidance and planning efforts at the State Water Board. Mr. Kuszmar updated the Board on the North Coast Cannabis Program with a review of the performance reports for Fiscal Years 2018/19 and 2019/20 and the Work Plan revisions for Fiscal year 2020/21. Board member Giusti inquired about a possible "amnesty program" or "fix-it ticket program" to promote compliance while avoiding costly and lengthy enforcement actions, as a way to incentivize enrollment into the Cannabis Cultivation Waste Discharge Regulatory Program. Board members Bedolla, Gant, and Chair Quinto each expressed support for staff's efforts and emphasized the need for more Program funding and staff in order to effectively manage the program. Nate Jacobsen, Counsel to the Board, Kason Grady, Division Chief, and Chief Deputy Director Bishop all responded.

- 5. Enforcement Update: Discussion of Regional Enforcement Priorities for 2020-2021. Diana Henrioulle, Senior, Enforcement Unit, gave the background of the Enforcement Unit's 2019 enforcement priorities and highlights, the current conditions, priorities for the upcoming year, with a review of the Supplemental Environmental Projects (SEP), and introduced Jordan Filak, Environmental Scientist Enforcement Unit, who gave an update on the Enforcement program performance and the Water Board's Environmental Complaint submission and tracking system.

Board member Giusti noted that the two commenters for this item identified concerns with the staff recommendation to remove non-Cannabis agriculture related violations from the list of priorities and their related concern for lack of enforcement actions

within Siskiyou County. Mr. Giusti reiterated that the Regional Water Board's regulatory and stewardship programs should be implemented uniformly and if a discharger fails to comply, they should face regulatory consequences, including progressive enforcement. Board member Bedolla thanked the two commenters and expressed support for Board member Giusti's comments. Ms. Henrioulle and Mr. St. John responded to the Board's concerns and said that staff would consider the public and Board member comments in making a final determination of the enforcement priorities for the coming year.
