

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CORRECTIVE ACTION

This notice invites the public to review and comment on the pending decision to implement corrective action to remediate petroleum releases at the cleanup site known as Texaco Willits, South, located at 781 South Main Street, in Willits. Corrective action measures will be implemented after the close of the public comment period unless new and significant information is submitted including that the corrective action plans needs revision.

Problem Description

In 1995, three underground storage tanks (USTs) were removed from the site. Subsurface investigation work revealed soil and groundwater impacts from fuel dischargers. The contaminants include total petroleum hydrocarbons gasoline (TPH-g), methyl tertiary butyl ether (MTBE), benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene and xylenes.

Site Characterization

Groundwater monitoring wells were installed to determine the impacts to water quality. Continued monitoring has provided information to conclude the extent of contamination has generally been defined.

Proposed Corrective Action

The responsible party for the site proposed to conduct dual phase extraction (DPE) as a corrective action to remediate impacted soil and groundwater. DPE consists of removing vapor and groundwater from the subsurface, treating each media above ground followed by disposal of the treated waste under appropriate permits.
