The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region (Regional Water Board) is considering coverage under General Waste Discharge Requirements (GWDR) Order No. R1-2006-0107 for the former Georgia-Pacific Fort Bragg Sawmill located at 90 West Redwood Avenue, Fort Bragg, California (Site). At the Site, some groundwater is impacted with chlorinated volatile organic compounds. The proposed corrective action is in-situ chemical oxidation using persulfate injection, which must be covered under GWDR Order No. R1-2006-0107.
