The North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) proposes to extend coverage under General Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) Order No. R1-2006-0107 for Manzana Products at 9141 Green Valley Road, in Sebastopol, California (Site). A release from underground storage tanks located at the site discharged petroleum hydrocarbons and associated chemicals to the subsurface that have impacted groundwater. The proposed corrective action for contamination is in-situ chemical oxidation, which must be covered under WDR Order No. R1-2006-0107.
