NOTICE OF RESCHEDULED PUBLIC HEARING

Administrative Civil Liability Order No. R1-2008-0008

On July 17, 2007, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region (Regional Water Board), Executive Officer issued Administrative Civil Liability Complaint No. R1-2007-0059, (renamed Administrative Civil Liability Order No. R1-2008-0008) (Order) to the California Department of Transportation (Discharger). The Order assesses civil liabilities under Water Code section 13385, subdivision (a)(1), (2), and (4) for alleged violations of a Water Quality Certification issued for the Confusion Hill Bypass project and the State Water Board's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit for Storm Water Discharges from the State of California, Department of Transportation Properties, Facilities and Activities, Order No. 99-06-DWQ.

Opportunity for Settlement Without a Public Hearing

A thirty-day public comment period ended on October 29, 2007. The Discharger requested a public hearing on this matter.

Public Hearing Procedures

The Regional Water Board will hold a public hearing on this matter on March 6, 2008 (rescheduled from September 12-13, 2007, January 17, 2008, and again from January 24, 2008) at 9:00 a.m., or as announced in the Regional Water Board's summary agenda to be mailed on or about February 22, 2008. The meeting is scheduled to be held at the River Lodge Conference Center - Coho Room, 1800 Riverwalk Drive, Fortuna, California. At the hearing, the Regional Water Board will consider whether to affirm, reject, or modify the proposed civil liability, or take other enforcement action.

The Discharger and interested persons were required to submit to the Regional Water Board office at 5550 Skylane Boulevard, Suite A, Santa Rosa, California, 95403, written copies of all technical reports, testimony, and other evidentiary material that they wanted the Regional Water Board to consider on this issue by 5:00 p.m. on October 29,

2007. This written material will be made available to the Regional Water Board members and all interested persons.

Written material received after the above date will not be accepted, except at the discretion of the Regional Water Board Chair. Untimely written material will not be accepted or incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice the Discharger or the Regional Water Board staff. The Chair may choose to modify this rule upon a showing of severe hardship (California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 648.1 and 648.4).

All those who plan to testify at the hearing must have submitted written statements to the Regional Water Board by October 29, 2007. The statements should have provided the name of the witness, their qualifications (if an expert), and the scope of their intended testimony. Testimony at the above-scheduled hearing may summarize or explain timely submitted or late-accepted written evidence, but shall not add new evidence. The time constraints for oral testimony or comments will be set by the Regional Water Board Chair and usually will allow no more than ten minutes each for Regional Water Board staff and the Discharger and three minutes each for other interested persons. A timer may be used and speakers are expected to honor the time limits. Where speakers can be grouped by affiliation or interest, such groups will be expected to select a spokesperson and not be repetitive.

At the hearing, the Regional Water Board will be advised by Samantha Olson, Staff Counsel of the State Water Resources Control Board's Office of Chief Counsel. The Regional Water Board's Enforcement Team will be advised by Kim Niemeyer, Staff Counsel of the State Water Resources Control Board's Office of Chief Counsel. The Enforcement Team is considered a party for the purposes of this proceeding, and like any other party in an enforcement matter, is bound by the rules governing ex parte communications with the Regional Water Board and its advisors. Kim Niemeyer is currently advising the Regional Water Board in other unrelated matters, but will not be advising the Regional Water Board in this matter.
