Problem Description

An unauthorized discharge of petroleum hydrocarbons was discovered at the above-referenced site during the removal of underground storage tanks. Subsurface investigations were conducted to define the extent of contamination in soil and groundwater. Groundwater monitoring indicates that groundwater meets water quality objectives (WQO) or will meet WQO through natural attenuation in a reasonable period of time. No water supply wells are impacted by the contamination.

Proposed Action

A “no further action” determination related to the discharge of petroleum hydrocarbons is proposed. This site meets the closure criteria specified by the State Water Resources Control Board’s “Low-Threat Underground Storage Tank Case Closure Policy.”

Unless significant comments are received or new information is presented regarding this site, Regional Water Board staff plans to proceed with the “no further action” process upon conclusion of the comment period.
