# North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board

Lead state agency responsible for protecting water quality in North Coast Region

- > Authorities:
- > The Federal Clean Water Act
- California's Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act
- The Water Quality Control Plan for the North Coast Region (Basin Plan)

## Purpose of Scoping

- Required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)
- Determine extent, focus, and content of environmental analysis
- Identify issues to eliminate from environmental analysis
- Identify alternatives
- Identify methods of assessment
- > Receive comments

## CEQA Analysis Environmental Factors

- > Aesthetics
- Agricultural Resources
- Air Quality
- Biological Resources
- Cultural Resources
- Geology and Soils
- Hazards and Hazardous Materials
- Hydrology and Water Quality

- Land Use and Planning
- Mineral Resources
- Noise
- Population and Housing
- Public Services
- > Recreation
- Transportation/Traffic
- Utilities and Service Systems
- Greenhouse Gas Emissions

#### **Need for Amendment**

- Remove and/or update outdated objectives, policies, tables, etc.
- > Add Action Plans
  - Address SWRCB requirement for groundwater salt / nutrient management plans
  - More efficient / effective regulation for protection of waters
  - Clarify any ambiguities
  - Promote consistency between regions
  - Provide for implementation of current standards

#### Proposed Amendment

- Update four existing water quality general objectives for groundwaters in Section 3 of the Basin Plan.
- Update the four existing narrative surface water objectives in Section 3 of the Basin Plan.
- Add a new narrative toxicity objective for groundwaters to Section 3 of the Basin Plan, Water Quality Objectives for Groundwaters;
- Remove the existing Table 3-2 and add a new Policy for the Application of Narrative Water Quality Objectives, to Section 4 of the Basin Plan that describes the process the Regional Water Board uses in establishing numeric values to implement narrative surface and groundwater water quality objectives.
- Delete the outdated Action Plan for Accidental Spills and Contingencies from Section 4 of the Basin Plan.
- Edit footnote #4 to Table 3-1 to reference the Policy for Application of Water Quality Objectives.
- Add a new "Action Plan to Control Wastewater and Process Waste/Wastewater from Land Disposal Activities," to Section 4 of the Basin Plan.

#### Salt & Nutrient Management Plans

- Required for all groundwater basins
- All pollutant sources (ag, wastewater, industry, etc.)
- Prepared by basin stakeholders
- Extensive monitoring/modeling and pollutant load allocations
- > Amendment may replace need
