<u>State Water Board Officials to Recognize Local Agencies for</u> Their Work to Further Governor Davis' Clean Beaches Efforts

Moonlight State Beach has about 2.68 million visitors each year. In the past two years, there were more than 100 beach closures/health postings due to the presence of bacterial pollution. State and local officials will be on hand to explain how the new Urban Runoff Treatment facility will reduce bacterial contamination at the beach.
