REVISED TENTATIVE WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS (WDRs) AND NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT – NEWHALL RANCH SANITATION DISTRICT, NEWHALL RANCH WATER RECLAMATION PLANT (CA0064556, CI-9322)

On September 30, 2013, the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) staff sent you tentative WDRs and NPDES permit for the above-mentioned Water Reclamation Plant. Regional Water Board staff considered comments submitted by the October 30, 2013, public comment deadline and prepared the enclosed written response to comments table.

In accordance with administrative procedures, this Board at a public hearing to be held on **December 5, 2013, at 9:00 a.m.**, at the **Metropolitan Water District of Southern California Board Room, 700 North Alameda Street, Los Angeles, California**, will consider the enclosed Tentative Requirements and comments submitted in writing regarding the changes contained within the proposed amended Order. The Board will hear any testimony pertinent to this discharge and the tentative requirements. It is expected that the Board will take action at the hearing; however, as testimony indicates, the Board, at its discretion, may order further action by staff.
