REVISED TENTATIVE WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS AND NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT – CITY OF THOUSAND OAKS HILL CANYON WATERTREATMENT PLANT (NPDES Permit No. CA0056294, CI # 4917)

We have revised the tentative National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit, based on written comments received by the May 16, 2008, comment period deadline, and based upon the proposed revisions to the Calleguas Creek Watershed Nitrogen Compounds and Related Effects Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL). Changes in the revised tentative NPDES Order appear in the strikeout/underline format.

The tentative NPDES permit, the tentative Time Schedule Order (TSO), and the TMDL revision are scheduled for adoption, as separate agenda items, during the September 11, 2008, Board meeting. Written comments regarding the tentative NPDES permit and the tentative TSO are not being solicited, as the comment period has ended. Written comments regarding the TMDL revisions should be addressed to TMDL staff, and should be submitted under separate cover.

Pursuant to the Federal Clean Water Act, as amended, and in accordance with the California Water Code, revised tentative waste discharge requirements have been prepared and are enclosed. Attachments G, I, J and K, as well as the TSO are not enclosed since they remain unchanged from the previous mailout. In accordance with administrative procedures, this Board at a public hearing to be held on September 11, 2008, at 9:00 a.m., at the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, Board Room, 700 North Alameda Street, Los Angeles, will consider the enclosed tentative requirements and comments submitted in writing regarding any and all portions thereof. The Board will hear any testimony pertinent to this discharge and the tentative requirements. It is expected that the Board will take action at the hearing; however, as testimony indicates, the Board, at its discretion, may order further investigation.
