Subject: Public Workshop on State and Federal Grants Request for Proposals (RFPs)

The Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (LARWQCB) and State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) will host a public workshop on May 1, 2002, at the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California. The purpose of this workshop is to:

- Announce the availability of application packages for the Costa-Machado Water Act of 2000 (Proposition 13) Phase II Grants, Step II-Final Stage application process. The Request for Grant Concept Proposal stage or initial stage of the grant process has been completed and applicants have been notified whether their projects met the pertinent program priorities and evaluated to be competitive. The successful applicants were formally invited to respond to Requests for Full Proposals (RFPs). Response to the RFP for the pertinent program is the last stage in the grant award process. Applications are due to SWRCB on **June 7, 2002**, by close of business (5:00 p.m.)
- Answer questions from interested parties pertaining to federal Fiscal Year 2003 Clean Water Act Section 319 (h) and 205(j) grant application process. Applications are due to SWRCB on **June 17, 2002**, by close of business (5:00 p.m.)
- Familiarize project proponents with this year's application process and provide opportunity for the public to ask questions and meet staff.

The first session will consist of a presentation by SWRCB staff on instructions for submitting full proposals for Phase II State Fiscal Year 2002 Proposition 13 grants. The rest of the workshop will consist of a question and answer session where project proponents will have an opportunity to speak with Regional Board staff about Proposition 13 and Federal Fiscal Year 2003 Clean Water Act grants application process and eligibility requirements.
