

Project Title: Amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for the Los Angeles Region to incorporate a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) for Trash in the Los Angeles River.

Project Description: Regional Board Resolution 01-013, adopted on September 19, 2001, by the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board amended the Basin Plan for the Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties by establishing a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) for trash in the Los Angeles River.

The trash TMDL holds the Los Angeles County Department of Public works and all cities within the Los Angeles River Watershed responsible for any trash discharged from their storm drains. It requires these discharges to be regulated under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System storm water permits. With a numeric target of zero, the 14-year implementation plan allows a gradual phased reduction of approximately 10%, of the current trash discharges, per year. In addition, the zero allocation will be re-evaluated once a trash reduction of 50% has been achieved.

As approved by the State Water Resources Control Board on February 19, 2002 under Board Resolution No. 2002-0038, the amendment revised


the Basin Plan by incorporating a total maximum daily load for trash in the Los Angeles River. The Office of Administrative Law approved the regulatory provisions of this amendment on July 16, 2002. Final approval of the TMDL from the United States Environmental Protection Agency was given on August 1, 2002.

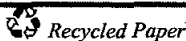
