ORDER R5-2016-XXXX

RESCISSION OF CALIFORNIA WATER CODE SECTION 13308 TIME
SCHEDULE AND CEASE AND DESIST ORDER R5-2007-0020

FOR
MADISON COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT
YOLO COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region, (hereafter referred to as "Central Valley Water Board") finds that:

1. On 16 March 2007, the Central Valley Water Board adopted California Water Code Section 13308 Time Schedule and Cease and Desist Order (Order) R5-2007-0020 for the Madison Community Services District (hereafter Discharger).
2. The Order was adopted to address a lack of wastewater storage and disposal capacity at the District's wastewater treatment facility (WWTF).
3. The Order required the Discharger to complete the following tasks:
 - a. Submit a Revenue Plan.
 - b. Submit and implement a Spill Contingency Plan
 - c. Submit and implement a Biosolids Assessment Report/Biosolids Management Plan.
 - d. Submit and implement an Inflow and Infiltration Assessment and Correction Workplan.
 - e. Evaluate wastewater treatment and disposal capacity and certify that the WWTF has adequate capacity to serve all parcels within the District's existing sphere of influence.
 - f. Submit a Report of Waste Discharge to expand the wastewater treatment facility if the WWTF does not have adequate treatment and disposal capacity to serve all parcels (developed and undeveloped) within the District's existing sphere of influence.
 - g. Submit a Groundwater Monitoring Well Installation Report.

- h. Submit a report certifying completion of improvements to the facility lift station, headworks, backup power supply and pond berm stabilization/raising for additional capacity.
4. The Order implemented a connection restriction that limited the number of new domestic and/or industrial connections to the wastewater treatment facility to four connections until the Order was revised or rescinded.
5. The Discharger has achieved compliance by completing the tasks in Order R5-2007-0020 and has demonstrated that the WWTF has sufficient capacity to serve future development within the District's current sphere of influence. Therefore, the connection restriction in the Order is no longer necessary. The upgraded WWTF is currently being regulated under WDR Order No. 5-00-039.
6. The Central Valley Water Board has notified the Discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to rescind Order R5-2007-0020 and has provided them with an opportunity for a public hearing and an opportunity for them to submit their written views and recommendations.
7. Time schedule orders and cease and desist orders are issued by the Central Valley Water Board to enforce underlying permit obligations. The issuance and rescission of this Order is therefore exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Pub. Resources Code, § 21000 et seq.) in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15321(a)(2).
8. The Central Valley Water Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments and evidence pertaining to this matter.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that California Water Code Section 13308 Time Schedule and Cease and Desist Order R5-2007-0020 is rescinded.
