

## LATE REVISIONS –2 August 2007

### Item 14 City of San Joaquin, Wastewater Treatment Facility, Fresno County

#### Cease and Desist Order

Page 3 Revise the “IT IS HERBY ORDERED” as follows:

**“IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that Cease and Desist Order No. R5-2002-0104 is rescinded, except for enforcement purposes, and that, pursuant to sections 13301 and 13267 of the California Water Code, the City of San Joaquin, its agents, successors, and assigns, shall:”

#### Waste Discharge Requirements

Page 5 Revise Finding 21 as follows:

“On 2 May 2006, the State Water Board adopted Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements For Sanitary Sewer Systems, Water Quality General Order No. 2006-003-DWQ (General Order). The General Order requires all public agencies that own or operate sanitary sewer systems greater than one mile in length to comply with the order. The Discharger’s collection system is greater than one mile in length; therefore, the General Order is applicable. ~~The application or Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under the general permit must be submitted to the State Water Resources Control Board by 1 November 2007.~~”

Page 10 Revise Finding 47 as follows:

“The Discharger, as the lead agency for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code Section 21000, et, seq.) and the State CEQA guidelines (Title 14, Division 6, California Code of Regulations, as amended), certified adopted a mitigated negative declaration (MND) on 11 April 2007, in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code Section 21000, et, seq.) and the State CEQA guidelines (Title 14, Division 6, California Code of Regulations, as amended). The MND indicates that the discharge will comply with Regional Water Board regulations, which will mitigate any groundwater impacts. The Regional Water Board is a responsible agency pursuant to CEQA. The Regional Water Board reviewed and considered the MND prepared by the Discharger. This Order contains requirements that will mitigate or avoid environmental effects on water quality.”

Page 16 Add the following as a new provision prior to Provision G.4, and renumber remaining provisions.

“For authorization to discharge monthly discharge flow of 0.5 mgd, the Discharger shall submit certification from a California registered civil engineer that the Expansion Project is complete and the WWTF can treat and dispose of these flows. Satisfaction of this provision is subject to written Executive Officer approval.”

Page 19 Add the following as a provision prior to Provision G.13, and renumber remaining provisions.

“The Discharger shall obtain coverage under, and comply with, Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements For Sanitary Sewer Systems, Water Quality Order No. 2006-003-DWQ.”
