Tuolumne County owns and operates the closed Class III Big Oak Flat Landfill. The facility is a municipal solid waste (MSW) landfill regulated under authority given in Water Code section 13000 et seq.; California Code of Regulations, title 27 ("Title 27"), section 20005 et seq.; and 40 Code of Federal Regulations section 258 in accordance with State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) Resolution 93-62.

The closed Facility is on a 10-acre parcel, which has one unlined waste management unit (Unit) covering five acres. The landfill was capped and closed in late 2002. In August 2005 without prior authorization from the Central Valley Water Board the Discharger rehabilitated downgradient groundwater monitoring wells GMW-2 and GMW-3. In the process of rehabilitating the wells the Discharger changed the well configuration by changing the well screen locations, pump depth location, and pump type (high flow to low flow). On 30 March 2012, the Central Valley Water Board staff issued a Notice of Violation (NOV) because the groundwater monitoring system is inconsistent with the current WDRs. The revised Order requires the Discharger to submit a Groundwater and Surface Water Monitoring Network Workplan that describes how the current groundwater detection monitoring network will be modified to comply with Title 27, Section 20415(b)(1)(B). The revised Order also requires the Discharger to submit a monitoring network upgrade report and submit a site topographic survey report.

A public hearing concerning this matter will be held during the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) meeting, which is scheduled for:

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

- County of Tuolumne Department of Public Works

Designated parties, but not interested persons, will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. Central Valley Water Board staff will prepare the administrative record, and may present evidence, make an oral presentation and cross-examine opposing witnesses.

Interested persons may not cross examine witnesses, and will not be subject to cross examination. Interested persons may submit evidence (e.g., photographs, eye-witness testimony, monitoring data) if the evidence is submitted in accordance with the deadlines for submitting evidence described below. Interested persons who present evidence may be subject to cross-examination. Interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **4 March 2013**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is affected by the discharge.

The tentative Waste Discharge Requirements were issued on 1 February 2013. Persons wishing to comment on this item must submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than noon on **4 March 2013**. Written materials submitted after noon on the above date will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Central Valley Water Board Chair. A party requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Central Valley Water Board Chair must find that the late submission would not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any designated party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Central Valley Water Board Chair. Both designated parties and interested persons may be asked to respond to clarifying questions from Central Valley Water Board members, counsel staff or others, at the discretion of the Central Valley Water Board.
