

My first comment on the the rules for pot waste proposal. Most of the public, including myself. Only learned of these proposals on Wednesday September 2nd and that the public had until Tues to comment!! Six days including the labor day holiday weekend is barely enough time, for a full study and public input on such short notice. The general public at large needs more time. As anything to do with marijuana grows, water, proposals, regulation, zoning etc is a very important issue, that affects every property owner and their families, health, well being, and safety.

Large grows may be allowed in Shasta county, but not here in Butte county. A hard and well fought battle, in Butte county, as Chris Jellison pointed out. Was on the ballot in November, Measure A, anti large outdoor grows, and Measure B. Pro. Measure A won by a landslide. The people of Butte county were sick and tired of the pot growers taking over our county, and list of negatives were and are well known.

Included in pot waste, should include, all the dead wildlife, deer, foxes, owls, hawks, eagles, all of our predator animals including, mountain lions and bobcats. My enclave which includes properties of 5, 7, 8, 10 and 20 acres. Was once abundant with wildlife, and now those numbers are down to Zero!!! poisoned by unregulated potent pesticides, used in abundance for their "grow". We are lucky if we see a squirrel.

Myself and the Measure A team, will fight vigorously for our ordinance and for what we have achieved. So upon reading that the "officials" and I would like to know who the "officials" are, who didn't want to be too strict with the rules and prevent people from participating!. Was very concerning.

Andrew Merkel does not represent Butte County as a whole. His Measure B proposed ordinance went down in a dismal failure, as well it should. The county will not be on board with licensing, because of our well supported ordinance. So do not presume Butte county will join in any of your 38 counties, so do not include us in any of your proposals, your not invited to tell us and 63% of the voters for Measure A. what to do.

I am wondering as to where and when your other workshops took place, and where was it advertised. Also the growers in the concow area, definately do not represent the area as a whole.

The foothill area's streams and creeks have been dry because of excess use of what little water we have being used for grows, many homeowners wells have gone dry. Don't expect Governor Brown to be on board of legalization, he has a little priority something called the DROUGHT!!.
