This document contains the responses to written comments received from interested parties regarding the proposed tentative Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) for the County of Tulare (County), Woodville Disposal Site, Tulare County for operation, construction, and corrective action. The Tentative WDRs, R5-2022-XXXX, were prepared to update as part of a policy of administrative review and to incorporate a change in their corrective action program. Currently, WDRs Order R5-2012-0059 regulates the facility.

The Tentative WDRs were circulated on 11 February 2022 for public comment, ending on 16 March 2022. A total of one letter/email was received and these comments are addressed below.

Comment A.1:

Waste Discharge Requirements, Financial Assurances F.3 and Monitoring and Reporting Program Table 18 and 7. Financial Assurance Report: Requests that due date of 1 June be changed to 1 October of each year for submittal of a financial assurances report.

Comment A.2:

Monitoring and Reporting Program, Attachment B - In this table, the Inorganics listed require USEPA Method 6010, 7041, 7131A, 7062, 7421, 7470A, 7521, 7742, and 7841 with Sulfide is listed under USEPA Method 9030B and Cyanide is listed under USEPA Method 9010C. The County requests the use of USEPA Method SM4500SF for Sulfide and SM4500CN for Cyanide. The County also requests the use of USEPA Method 200.8 for all other Inorganics listed to be consistent with Attachment B of the Visalia Landfill MRP R5-2021-0009 adopted 18 February 2021.
