## Requirement to Submit Work Plan Deliverable under the 13267 Order Issued to County of Lake

## You are legally obligated to respond to this request. Please read this letter carefully.

You are receiving this letter because, based on information available to the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (Central Valley Water Board or Board), you are required to submit a Work Plan as stated under the California Water Code section 13267 Order (Order) issued to County of Lake. The Order, which requires the submittal of technical information describing the management practices implemented to reduce phosphorus loads to Clear Lake, was issued on 10 October 2019 because Lake County is one of the responsible parties identified and assigned a load allocation in the 2006 Clear Lake Nutrient TMDL.

Based on information submitted to staff on 09 April 2021, Board staff have concluded that Lake County is not in compliance with the assigned load allocation. Under the 13267 Order, Lake County is responsible for submitting a Work Plan outlining when and how compliance will be achieved. The Work Plan to reduce discharges of phosphorus and comply with the designated allocation is due to the Board within six months of the notification that this letter has been received.

The report must adhere to the requirements outlined in the original Order. This Work Plan shall include:

- A detailed timeline outlining when Lake County will be in compliance with the specified load allocation,
- Additional management practices that will be implemented,
- The potential locations of future management practices, and
- A quantitative estimate of the load reduction based on the methods outlined in the Work Plan.
