- CHRONOLOGY:** July 1, 1986 Waste Discharge Requirements
Adopted (Board Order No. 6-86-73)
- ISSUE:** Should the Water Board rescind Waste Discharge Requirements
issued to the Watt Family Properties, Inc., for the Mesa Pacifica
Village Mobile Home Park and Desert Willow Recreational Vehicle
Park?
- DISCUSSION:** The mobile home park constructed an onsite packaged wastewater
treatment plant with seepage pits for wastewater disposal. The
onsite wastewater treatment plant is no longer in use and has been
removed from service because the mobile home park and
recreational vehicle park sewer collected systems are connected to
City of Hesperia sewer lines. Rescission is appropriate because
there is no longer a sewage discharge from the facility.
- RECOMMENDATION:** Adopt the Rescission Order as proposed.

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Lahontan Region (Water Board) finds:

1. Discharger and Facility Description

The Mesa Pacifica Village Mobile Home Park (MHP) and Desert Willow Recreational Vehicle Park (RVP) are located west of Interstate 15 at Main Street in Hesperia. The mobile home park had an onsite package wastewater treatment plant with seepage pits for wastewater disposal.

2. Permit History

Board Order No. 6-86-73 was adopted on July 1, 1986, establishing requirements for the discharge of domestic wastewater from the Mesa Pacifica Village MHP and the Desert Willow RVP.

3. Reason for Action

This action is being taken to rescind Board Order No. 6-86-73 because the onsite wastewater treatment plant is no longer in use. The mobile home park and recreational vehicle park are both connected to City of Hesperia sewer lines.

4. Conclusion

It is in the public interest to rescind Board Order No. 6-86-73, since Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) are no longer necessary for the reasons described above and should be rescinded.

5. California Environmental Quality Act

Rescission of the WDRs is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code section 21000, et seq.) in accordance with section 15321, title 14, California Code of Regulations.

6. Notification of Interested Parties

The Water Board has notified the Discharger and interested parties and agencies of its intent to rescind Board Order No. 6-86-73. Opportunity to comment was provided starting in August 2014 using U.S. mail, e-mail, and internet posting.

7. Public Meeting

The Water Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments pertaining to the rescission of Board Order No. 6-86-73.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT pursuant to Water Code sections 13260 and 13263, Board Order No. 6-86-73 is hereby rescinded.
