# CALIFORNIA REGIONAL WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD COLORADO RIVER BASIN REGION

**ORDER NO. 88-58** 

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
FOR
LAKES COUNTRY CLUB ASSOCIATION, INC.
Wastewater Reclamation
Indian Wells - Riverside County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

- Lakes Country Club Association, Inc., 161 Old Ranch Road, Palm Desert, CA 92260 (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), submitted a Report of Waste Discharge, dated February 10, 1988, for the proposed irrigation of a golf course and common areas, using reclaimed wastewater provided by Coachella Valley Water District.
- 2. The maximum irrigation design flow would be one (1) mgd, and the average design flow would be 0.6 mgd. The golf course and common areas are located in Section 10, T5S, R6E, SBB&M.
- 3. Tertiary reclaimed water would be provided to the Lakes Country Club by Coachella Valley Water District.
- 4. The Water Quality Control Plan for the Colorado River Basin Region of California was adopted by the Board on November 14, 1984.
- 5. The beneficial uses of the ground water of the Coachella Hydrologic Subunit are:
  - a. Municipal supply
  - b. Industrial supply
  - c. Agricultural supply
- 6. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to udpate waste discharge requirements for the discharge.
- 7. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the existing discharge.
- 8. The requirements prescribed below establish acceptable levels of constituents of reclaimed water in accordance with Title 22, Division 4, of the California Code of Regulations, in order to ensure that the use of reclaimed water for the specified purposes does not impose undue risks to public health.
- 9. These waste discharge requirements govern an existing facility, which the discharger is currently operating, and therefore is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act in accordance with Section 15301, Chapter 3, Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations.

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IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following:

### A. Discharge Specifications

- 1. Reclaimed water shall only be used for landscape irrigation of the common areas and golf course described in the findings of this Order. Prior to making use of reclaimed water purveyed by the Coachella Valley Water District (CVWD) for any other purpose or at any other location, the user shall obtain any necessary authorization from CVWD and waste discharge requirements from this Regional Board.
- 2. Irrigation with reclaimed wastewater shall be conducted under the direct control of the discharger at all times.
- 3. An on-site supervisor responsible for operation of the reclaimed wastewater system shall be designated by the user. The supervisor shall be responsible for the installation, operation and maintenance of the irrigation system, enforcing this Order, prevention of potential hazards, maintenance of the distribution system plans in "as-built" form, and of the distribution of the reclaimed wastewater in accordance with this Order. The name and business phone number of the on-site supervisor shall be furnished to the Regional Board at least 30 days prior to commencement of use of reclaimed wastewater. The discharger shall also authorize the designated supervisor to report any non-compliance with this Order to the Regional Board in accordance with Discharge Specification No. 5, below.

- 4. The designated supervisor shall report any noncompliance with this Order to the Regional Board. This information shall be provided orally to the Regional Board within 24 hours from the time the on-site supervisor becomes aware of the circumstances. A written submission shall also be provided to the Regional Board within five days of the time the on-site supervisor becomes aware of the circumstances. The written submission shall contain:
  - a. A description of the noncompliance and its cause;
  - b. The period of noncompliance, including exact dates and times, and if the noncompliance has not been corrected, the anticipated time it is expected to continue; and
  - c. Steps taken or planned to reduce, eliminate, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance.


5. A freeboard depth of at least two (2) feet shall be maintained in each infiltration basin and/or holding basin.

#### B. Provisions

- 1. The treatment and discharge of waste shall not cause a pollution or a nuisance as defined in Sections 13050(1) and 13050(m) of the California Water Code.
- 2. Lakes Country Club shall assure that notification of the use of reclaimed wastewater is provided to people who reside adjacent to irrigation reuse areas, to golf course patrons and to park users. The content of the notice and method of notification shall be approved by the Executive Officer. Notification of the public shall commence at least 30 days prior to commencement of golf course irrigation with reclaimed water.
- 3. The discharger shall allow an authorized representative of the Regional Board, upon the presentation of credentials and other documents as may be required by law, to:
  - a. Enter upon the discharger's premises where a regulated facility or activity is located or conducted, or where records must be kept under the conditions of this Order;
  - b. Have access to and copy, at reasonable times, any records that must be kept under the conditions of this Order;
  - c. Inspect at reasonable times any facilities, equipment (including monitoring and control equipment), practices, or operations regulated or required under this Order; and
  - d. Sample or monitor at reasonable times, for the purpose of assuring compliance with this Order or as otherwise authorized by the California Water Code, any substances or parameters at any location.

## MONITORING

Lakes Country Club Association, Inc. (discharger) shall submit to the Regional Board an annual report containing the following:

- A. Total number of gallons of tertiary wastewater used in the previous 12 month period.
- B. An estimation of the number of gallons of tertiary wastewater that will be used in the next 12-month period.

### REPORTING

Any non-compliance with the discharge specifications of Board Order No. 88-58, in accordance with the procedure contained in discharge specification No. 4 of said Order shall be reported.

Annual reports shall be submitted to the Regional Board by January 15th of each year to:
