SUBJECT: Rescission of Waste Discharge Requirements: Tentative Order No. R9-2007-0022 is an Order rescinding the following waste discharge requirements: (Eric Becker)

- a) Order No. 92-34, Waste Discharge Requirements for Otay Water District, Hidden Valley Estates Reclamation Plant, Spring Valley.
- b) Order No. 94-133, Waste Discharge Requirements for Simon Vander Woude Dairy, San Diego County
- c) Order No. 96-11, Waste Discharge Requirements for the U.S. Marine Corps, Project P-552, San Diego County
- d) Order No. 2000-0206, NPDES No. CA0109321, Waste Discharge Requirements for Jules Wesselink, Wesselink and Son Dairy, Riverside County
- e) Order No. R9-2000-0004, NPDES No. CA0001228, Waste Discharge Requirements for Southern California Edison Company, San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station Unit 1, San Diego County

PURPOSE: To adopt tentative Order No. R9-2007-0022 rescinding Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Order Nos. 92-34, 94-133, 96-11, 2000-04, and 2000-0206.

PUBLIC NOTICE: Notification of this action was included in the April 11, 2007 agenda notice, which was mailed on March 16, 2006 and has been posted on the Regional Board web page. This notification satisfies the requirements pursuant to State Government Code Section 11125 for a 10-day notice.

DISCUSSION: Tentative Order No. R9-2006-0007 would rescind the WDRs for the five subject facilities for the following reasons:

1. Otay Water District, Hidden Valley Estates Reclamation Plant By letter dated November 14, 2006, Mr. John M. Stewart, President of Brookfield Homes, requested rescission of Order No. 92-34 because plans for construction of the facility have been delayed for the foreseeable future. On March 1, 2007, an inspection of the proposed site verified that the plant was not constructed.
2. Simon Vander Woude Dairy, North of San Marcos During a routine area survey in November 2005, Industrial Compliance Unit found the site of the former Simon Vander Woude Dairy was vacated. Subsequent attempts to contact Mr. Vander Woude were unsuccessful and based upon a further inspection of the property on December 21, 2006, it has been concluded that all dairy operations were terminated by Mr. Vander Woude at this site.
3. U.S. Marine Corps Project P-552 By letter dated January 11, 2007, Mr. A.C. Entingh, Head of the Environmental Compliance Department at USMC Camp Pendleton, requested rescission of Order 96-11. This Order specified requirements for dredging approximately 7,250 cubic yards (cy) at Del Mar Boat Basin in Camp Pendleton, with disposal of the dredged material to an area offshore of Oceanside, San Diego County. Mr. Entingh stated that Project P-552 was completed on August 14, 1996.
4. Kampen Brothers Dairy By letter dated January 10, 2007, Mr. Henry Kampen notified the Regional Board that his dairy operations at 32605 Holland Road in Riverside County. The property owner, Mr. Leo Wesselink, has been in contact with the Regional Board regarding his future plans for the site, but has indicate that currently there are no parties interested in operating a dairy in the immediate future. Mr. Wesselink is aware that a report of waste discharge must be filed and waste discharge requirements adopted prior to dairy operations resuming on his property.
5. Southern California Edison Company, San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station Unit 1 By letter dated February 6, 2007, Mr. H.W. Newton, Manager of Site Support Services for Southern California Edison,

notified the Regional Board that the discharge to the SONGs Unit 1 outfall had been terminated with the installation of stop gates and that all remaining low volume waste streams from Unit 1 had been routed to Unit 2 and 3 outfalls. The requirements in Order No. R9-2005-0005 (NPDES Permit No. CA0108073) for Unit 2 and Order No. R9-2005-0006 (NPDES Permit No. CA0108181) for Unit 3 include provisions for the Unit 1 discharge. An inspection of SONGs by the Regional Board on March 12, 2007 verified the discharge to the Unit 1 outfall was terminated.
