Mr. Kellerhouse:

Enclosed is Notice of Violation (NOV) No. R9-2016-0131 issued to Galway Downs, LLC, hereinafter the Discharger, for violations of Water Code sections 13260 and 13264, Waste Discharge Prohibitions in the *Water Quality Control Plan for the San Diego Basin* (Basin Plan), and Order WQ 2015-0121-DWQ – *General Waste Discharge Requirements for Composting Operations* (General Order). As described in the NOV, the violations may subject the Discharger to further enforcement pursuant to the Water Code. The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) reserves the right to take any further enforcement action authorized by law.

To avoid further enforcement action by the San Diego Water Board on these violations, the Dischargers must take immediate action to provide the San Diego Water Board with a complete NOI and technical report to enroll the Property in the General Order. Under the authority of Water Code section 13267, the Discharger must provide the San Diego Water Board with a technical report including all of the information requested in Attachment D of the General Order and a time schedule for compliance with the requirements of the General Order. The complete NOI, technical report, and schedule must be received by the San Diego Water Board no later than 5:00 pm on October 4, 2016.

NOTICE OF VIOLATION No. R9-2016-0131

Mr. Robert Kellerhouse Galway Downs 38801 Los Corralitos Road Temecula, CA 92592 Violations of Water Code Sections 13260 and 13264, Provisions of the Water Quality Control Plan for the San Diego Basin, and General Order WQ 2015-0121-DWQ

July 7, 2016

Galway Downs, LLC, hereinafter the Discharger, is hereby notified that the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) reserves the right to take any enforcement action authorized by law for the violations described herein.

The Discharger is in violation of Water Code sections 13260 and 13264, Waste Discharge Prohibitions specified in the *Water Quality Control Plan for the San Diego Basin* (Basin Plan), and Order WQ 2015-0121-DWQ – *General Waste Discharge Requirements for Composting Operations* (Compost General Order). The violations described below were identified by the San Diego Water Board on December 17, 2015 and April 8, 2016 during inspections of the Galway Downs property (Property), where the Dischargers maintain an area² for the discharge of waste to land for the production of compost (see Figure 1 below).

A. Summary of Violations

1. Failure to Submit a Report of Waste Discharge or a Notice of Intent to Enroll in Order WQ 2015-0121-DWQ

On April 28, 2016, San Diego Water Board staff verbally confirmed with the compost operation operator, Agriscape, Inc., that a complete Report of Waste Discharge (ROWD) or Notice of Intent (NOI) to enroll in the Compost General Order for the discharge of wastes to land at the Property had not been filed with the San Diego Water Board. State law requires the discharger do one or the other.

Section 13260(a) of the Water Code requires that any persons discharging waste or proposing to discharge waste within the San Diego region, that could affect the quality of the waters of the State, must submit an ROWD and an annual fee.³ A

complete ROWD (Form 200)⁴ must contain sufficient information for the San Diego Water Board to prescribed waste discharge requirements (WDRs).

The State Water Resources Control Board developed and adopted the General Order⁵ on August 4, 2015. The General Order establishes statewide WDRs for composting operations to address water quality and beneficial use protection mandates specified in division 7 of the Water Code. New and existing composting operations meeting the eligibility criteria specified in the General Order, are required to seek coverage by submitting a complete NOI,⁶ including the appropriate filing fee,⁷ and a technical report including, but not limited to, information request in Attachment D of the General Order.

2. Initiating a New Discharge of Waste to Land

During the December 17 inspection, San Diego Water Board staff observed that the Discharger initiated a discharge of compostable wastes to land as shown in photographs 1 through 4.

Section 13264(a) of the Water Code requires that no person shall initiate any new discharge of waste prior to submitting an ROWD,⁸ and satisfying the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

3. Failure to Comply with the Basin Plan, Waste Discharge Prohibitions

The discharge of compostable wastes to land noted in Violation 2 is also a violation of Basin Plan discharge prohibitions.

The Basin Plan⁹ prohibits the following discharges:

- Waste Discharge Prohibition No. 1. The discharge of waste to waters of the State in a manner causing, or threatening to cause a condition of pollution, contamination, or nuisance, as defined in Water Code section 13050;
- Waste Discharge Prohibition No. 2. The discharge of waste to land, except as authorized by WDRs or the terms described in Water Code section 13264; and

 Waste Discharge Prohibition No. 5. The discharge of waste to inland surface waters, except in cases where the quality of the discharge complies with applicable receiving water quality objectives.

Waters of the State include both surface water and groundwater. According to the Basin Plan map, ¹⁰ the Property is located in the Pechanga Hydrologic Area (902.50) of the Santa Margarita Hydrologic Unit.(902.00). ¹¹ Beneficial uses specified for inland surface waters (i.e., Temecula Creek) include municipal and domestic supply, agricultural supply, and groundwater recharge. Groundwater beneficial uses include municipal and domestic, and agricultural supplies.

The discharge of compostable waste to land is eligible for enrollment in the Compost General Order. Therefore, to avoid further enforcement action by the San Diego Water Board on these violations, the Discharger must take immediate action to provide the San Diego Water Board with a complete NOI and technical report to enroll the Property in the General Order. In accordance with Water Code section 13267, the Discharger must furnish the San Diego Water Board with a technical report which includes all of the information requested in Attachment D of the General Order and a schedule for compliance with the requirements of the General Order. The complete NOI, technical report, and schedule must be received by the San Diego Water Board no later than 5:00 pm on October 4, 2016.

B. Summary of Potential Enforcement Options

The violations cited above may subject the Discharger to additional enforcement by the San Diego Water Board or State Water Resources Control Board, including a potential civil liability assessment of \$5,000 per day of violation (Water Code section 13268) and/or any of the following enforcement actions:

In addition, the San Diego Water Board may consider referring the matter to other resource agencies, referring the matter to the State Attorney General for injunctive relief, and referring the matter to the municipal or District Attorney for criminal prosecution.
