SUBJECT: TRANSMITTAL OF REGIONAL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. R9-2002-0123,
ADOPTING AN AMENDMENT TO THE 'WATER QUALITY CONTROL
PLAN FOR THE SAN DIEGO BASIN (9)' (BASIN PLAN) TO
INCORPORATE A TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOAD FOR DIAZINON IN
THE CHOLLAS CREEK WATERSHED

At a Regional Board meeting on August 14, 2002, our Board members voted to amend the Basin Plan to incorporate a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) for Diazinon in the Chollas Creek watershed. This TMDL amends the Implementation Chapter (Chapter 4) of the Water Quality Control Plan for the San Diego Basin (9) [Basin Plan] to establish a TMDL for diazinon in the Chollas Creek Watershed, a program to implement the TMDL and to monitor its effectiveness.

By copy of this memorandum we are transmitting two indexed copies of the administrative record for Resolution No. R9-2002-0123, Basin Plan Amendment and Technical Report entitled "Total Maximum Daily Load for Diazinon in Chollas Creek Watershed, San Diego County"; a clear and concise summary of regulatory provisions; and an electronic copy of the interested parties mailing list directly to the Division of Water Quality, Water Quality Planning Unit.
